COMMUNITY POLICING

This will be my final input for your village magazine as I will be retiring from the police force in July after nearly 30 years service. As your Community Beat Officer my experiences in Coddington have been varied and interesting, at times challenging. Together we have achieved positive results, not to the satisfaction of all I know, but you cannot please all of the people all of the time.

Since around September / October last year certain locations around the village had problems. They were tackled with the formation of the Safer Neighbourhood Team which included me, N&SDC Community Safety Partnership, Parish Councillors, Neighbourhood Watch and anyone else with an interest in your village. The initial meetings were lively with plenty to talk about, but at the last meeting there was nothing to discuss, hopefully, and perhaps naively, I take the view that things have improved.

My successor has not yet been selected but meanwhile I leave you in the very capable hands of your two Police Community Support Officers Mike Munro and Harriett Samson-Bailey. I encourage you to contact them at Newark Police Station if you feel the need, they do not bite and I know they will do their very best to assist in any way they can.

What we need now is a Special Constable for the village and surrounding area. Could it be you? Notts Police are always interested in people who are interested in becoming a 'Special'. If you are interested contact Newark Police Station reception, the receptionist will take your details and pass them on. Have an informal chat with PCSO Mike Munro who would perhaps be a better person to see as he was a 'Special' for many years, the latter being in the Sergeant rank, so he can give you his views and share his experiences. There is an information pack available so we could quite easily get one to you. Think about it.

Finally, it's goodbye from me, thanks to all that have helped me over the years and I send you all my very best wishes for the future.



In March Coddington History Group organised another School Reunion photo for former pupils of the National School on Main Street (now the Scout Hall).

This Church of England School was built in 1846. It was originally a single room measuring 40 by 16ft built on land gifted by Rev. J.E. Hutchinson of East Stoke and until 1883 the teachers were John and Mary Roberts who lived next door in the Old Vicarage on Church (now Chapel) Lane. After the Roberts came Joseph Chauntry Hunt.

Another small classroom was added at the rear around 1890 to give more space for the 51 children then attending. It was later extended to its current size and various improvements made over the years including the fitting of new stoves in 1915. In 1987 local historian Rolf Vernon wrote an account of the school up to 1900 using the school logbook which he borrowed from its custodian Rev. Peter Wright. In November 1922 it recorded that there were 137 pupils. Unfortunately the whereabouts of the logbook is not now known and the book is out of print but available at Newark library.

With the building of the RAF houses on Harvey Avenue in the 1950's the school was too small and the current school on Brownlow's Hill was built, the children gradually moving down there from 1956. Now the building is very well used by the Scouts who own it and also let it out to outside groups.

The Village Sign and Time Capsule



The story of the village sign begins with Barry King of Main Street who worked as a member of the Architectural staff of the Midlands Division of Scottish & Newcastle Breweries Nottingham and had been asked to redesign the corporate signage for the then takeover of the Home Brewery, Nottingham.

Barry felt that if Coddington had a village sign, it would give it greater identity. He first raised the idea with the Parish council and his design was published in the autumn 1993 edition of CCN. The Parish Council was impressed with the design and Barry was put in charge of the project. One of his most time consuming jobs was applying for, and getting, planning permission. Newark & Sherwood planning office said it was out of their remit and he had to apply to the Ministry of Transport in London. It gave verbal planning permission reasonably quickly, but took a long time to confirm it in writing.

The Parish council involved the local school children in a competition to come up with suggestions for the sign, about 30 children designed posters and 10-year-old Nicholas Greenfield won the competition and was awarded a gift voucher.

Nicholas was a member of the 1st Coddington cub pack at the time having started as a Beaver and progressed through to his Duke of Edinburgh awards. He went on to attend the Magdalene and later the Magnus schools.

After A levels, he joined the Royal Air Force at the age of 19. He trained as a Propulsion Technician and is currently working on Merlin helicopters at 28 Squadron R.A.F.Benson, Oxford. At the end of the year, he will be serving his 3rd tour in Iraq.

The sign was made and painted by Barry King, which took him over 50 hours.

The unveiling ceremony was in December 1994 by the Reverend Peter Wright, Paul Dorling (Headmaster), Bernard Allen (Chairman of the Parish Council) and Barry King. However, as planning permission had not been received in writing, the sign was immediately removed.

About a fortnight later, when planning permission came through, a team which included Bernard Allen, John Smallwood, John Bartley, Barry King and Hugh Daybell dug the hole to bury the" Time Capsule" in a square metre of concrete and the sign was erected above it.

To show their appreciation of Barry King's hard work he was presented with a cut glass crystal tankard, which has the following inscription, "Presented to Barry King for all your hard work on the village sign from Coddington Parish Council with many thanks April 1995".

Unfortunately, on the night of 31st January 1999 some hooligans tied a rope to the top of the sign and pulled it down (with a car). The sign was then carried and dumped in the garden of Pat & John Bartley.

After this the sign was fitted with metal legs, repainted by Barry King and re-erected in time for the millennium.

The painting on the sign depicts Constance Penswick-Smith receiving a Mothering Sunday card from a young girl and a bunch of flowers from a young boy, All Saints Church, the Windmill, a Lancaster bomber, the Rookery, a farm tractor, a fox and a badger.

CONSTANCE PENSWICK SMITH - (1878-1938)

Constance Penswick Smith came to Coddington at the age of 12, when her father the Reverend Charles Penswick Smith was appointed Vicar of All Saints' Church Coddington.

In 1913 she began to devote her life to re-establishing the true Christian celebration of Mothering Sunday in a campaign, which was to last for 25 years.

Constance Penswick Smith died in 1938, at the age of 60 and was buried at Coddington next to her father.

CODDINGTON WINDMILL

The windmill, now a private house, without cap or sails, has a tarred brick tower and is about 5 minutes walk beyond the Moat on Balderton Lane.

There have been earlier windmills in the Coddington area, including a timber windmill, which was insured in 1789 by Valentine Farmorice. In 1818, John Else owned a newly built Smock Mill with brick base. William Else owned a post mill on a separate site. A number of millers came and went until 1831, when William Lee is recorded as the first of a Coddington milling dynasty.

The Lee family worked/owned the mill for the remainder of its life. In 1859, a Tower Mill replaced the mill. They installed a 10 horsepower steam engine in 1862, and an oil-engine between 1932 and 1936. The mill was used until 1944 but was damaged in WWII. The property was sold in 1947 and was listed in 1969. Described as derelict in 1974, the tower has been restored since 1984 and converted into a private house.

One may ask the question today why this country wants to build windmills to produce electricity when in 1862; 145 years ago "Wind" was replaced by steam power due to its unreliability.

The Lancaster Bomber

Winthorpe aerodrome was situated between the villages of Winthorpe and Coddington. It was built in the late 30's as a satellite station for Swinderby and opened officially in September 1940.

Polish bomber squadrons initially used the aerodrome for training. On the 18th July 1941 the Polish squadrons moved to Hemswell, and eventually No 455 Squadron of Coastal Command arrived with Handley Page Hampden (twin engined) bombers.

In 1942 an intense building programme took place including the construction of hard runways designed to accommodate heavy bombers. On the 1st of January 1943 No 1661 H.C.U. (Heavy Conversion Unit) used the airfield for training and 10 Lancaster Bombers were used. On the 16th January 1943, Lancaster bombers from Winthorpe took part in "Operation Target Berlin".

Farming

Farming is one of the few industries left in the village. The number of farms has declined from approximately 17 in 1950 and now only 4 families remain, the Allens, Hutchinsons, Whites and Handburys farming over 95% of the land. Interestingly we have an equestrian centre in the village.

THE ROOKERY

This is at "The Old Parsonage" Newark Road.

WILD LIFE

Represented by a fox and a badger; the village has numerous foxes and a badger sett. Did the fox represent fox hunting?

Both the Parish Council and the History group use the sign as their emblem

THE TIME CAPSULE

It was also decided to bury a "Time Capsule" underneath the village sign. The capsule was a green plastic cylinder, provided by John Collier, who had been a Scout Leader.
