Coddington Film Group announces Autumn Season

After a very successful Spring season the newly formed Coddington Film Group will be continuing their monthly showings from September. Here's what's on, all dates are the fourth Thursday of the month:

27 September - The Devil Wears Prada (Cert 12) - a comedy starring Meryl Streep as a high-powered fashion magazine editor. Anne Hathaway also stars, as Miranda's new assistant, a small-town girl in her first job out of college, trying to navigate a world she's only glimpsed in print while surviving her impossibly demanding new boss.

25 October - Walk the Line (Cert 12A) - a biography of the first half of Johnny Cash's life, with some excellent music and starring Joaquin Phoenix as Johnny Cash. As he pioneered a fiercely original sound that blazed a trail for rock, country, punk, folk and rap stars to come, Cash began a rough-and-tumble journey of personal transformation. He evolved from a self-destructive pop star into the iconic "Man in Black" learning how to walk the razor-thin line between destruction and redemption. Also stars Reese Witherspoon as June Carter. A film which appeals well beyond fans of country music.

22 November – Miss Potter (Cert U) - a magical biopic that follows Beatrix Potter's rise to being the most successful children's author of all time, starring Renée Zellweger and Ewan McGregor. The film reveals how she developed her artistic and story-telling abilities from a young age and rebelled against the conventions of the time by refusing to marry for the sake of it.

27 December – Chronicles of Narnia, **The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe** (Cert PG) - a special film at Christmas for children and grown ups.. The film tells the story of four children who go to live with an old professor during the war. One day, while playing hide and seek, Lucy, the youngest of the children, finds a wardrobe which leads to a magical land called Narnia. Endless adventures and dramas ensue.

'Just a few lines from the Tenants and Residents Association of Coddington. "We held our AGM in June when I was once again elected as Secretary. I had intended to stand down this year but it was not to be. The rest of the committee are: Margaret Russell (Chairperson), Ann O'Sullivan (Vice Chair), Maureen Tinsley (Treasurer), Diana Jones, Muriel Davies, Arthur Davies, Bill Tomlinson, Wendy Parrett and George Matthews. If you have any queries regarding our Group please contact any of the above. We are still trying to get something done about the grassed area at the back of Well Green Community Centre, to make it more maintenance friendly. The Council do cut the grass but unfortunately the surrounding border gets very much neglected making it rather an eyesore. The paths and roadway at the rear of the flats are in need of repair and we are liaising with the Council to try to get these sorted. In July we held an Open Meeting with a representative from Newark and Sherwood Homes, who spoke to us regarding the Decent Homes Project. Unfortunately Coddington is way down the list for any improvements to be done - part of the village about December 2008 and the remainder in 2009/2010. On 6th September we are holding a Community Meet and Greet event at Well Green House, from 10a.m. to 12 noon. This will give tenants a chance to meet and talk to their Local Housing Officer, the NCHA Tenant Participation Officer and Police Community Support Officers. On this date free door viewers or personal alarms will be available. The meeting will be followed by light refreshments and there will also be a raffle. All Newark and Sherwood Homes and Nottingham Community Housing Association tenants welcome to attend."

Golden Garden Competition 2007 - Results

Thankfully, the judges, (last year's winners) Gill Arwell and Nancy & Ralph Sleight were blessed with a dry morning for their tour of the village gardens and they all remarked how interesting - an experience it was.

The weather had not been helpful this year but this didn't stop us collecting a good number of candidates for our three favourites, there were not many "hidden" garden entered - but we collected more on the way by gently twisting the arms of gardeners we met en route!

In numerical order - our three winners are:

3 Penswick Grove where Mrs Anna Pringle's hidden back garden was a compact delight with lilies flowering happily near the healthy looking lettuces and peas - we resisted pinching a pod or two! Mrs Pringle is unable to do the physical gardening now but obviously supervises her son very well!

The Ridings, 4 Newark Road. Fred and Nora Reed obviously take a lot of care of their garden and also extend the colour onto the outside so passers-by can enjoy the clematis growing up the fence, the shrub border is always colourful and the water features provide extra interest for visitors nearer the house.

The garden at Moat Edge, 28 Balderton Lane has been admired by the garden judges for several years and this year looks even better than before. Easily admired by those walking by, the clematis etc on the house walls provide a good backdrop to the other colourful plants and the north facing shrub bed always looks neat and tidy.

The Thorpe Oaks estate is maturing now and judging by the standard of the tiny front gardens, for instance 15 Bristol Close where a lot has been packed into a small space, we thought that some people were hiding their skills from us in the back gardens - hopefully some will enter next year. The front gardens of Post Office Row, Main Street looked good, especially No. 22 where we were delighted by previous winner Janet Lord's cottage style back garden with pergola and water feature. Along Balderton Lane we admired the containers alongside the drive at No 19, we secured an invitation to the back garden too and admired the unusual containers there as well as the veg. garden. On the other side of Balderton Lane the large front gardens at 16 and 18 were excellent as usual - they also have won in the past. Elsewhere 3 Parklands Close was well planted and 19 Parkes Close was full to the brim with colourful flowers.

When the judges are "stuck" trying to choose just three winners we may take into account whether the gardens have won previously but people have, and will in the future, win more than once - it all depends on the standard of the gardens on the day. As ever, the judges declared they had enjoyed their walkabout - I thank them for doing it for the village this year. CODDINGTON SCOUTS

1st Coddington Scout Group was founded in 1938 by Bishop Cyril Bulley, Priest in Charge of Coddington and was originally 1st Coddington (All Saints). The troop met in a barn on Vale Farm (now Rosevale) owned by the Handbury family.

The Scout leader was George Morrell, assisted by Bob Herbert.

After the war the troop was re-formed by Ken Maltby.

Registration of the group took place on 20/7/1950, priest in charge at the time was Rev. Cradock Watson.

Ken Maltby left the group to do his National Service.

Trevor Town moved from 8th Newark (Salvation Army) Scout Group in Newark in about 1958 and was a leader with the Group running Cubs and Scouts. In June 1960 he took a group of 1 Rover and 12 Scouts to Walesby Camp Site for a weeklong camp.

Mr Town was awarded the Medal of Merit in 1966.

In 1969 the Group opened the old National School as the permanent Head Quarters of the Scout Group.

He then became Group Scout Leader and resigned in 1971.

From 1964 Gill Burgess was with the Cub Pack until she went to 7th Newark.

Tony Nash was Group Scout Leader from 1971 to the early 80's

1996 marked another first for the Group John Collier started a new Venture unit for Young people between the ages of 15 to 20. It was called Rosevale after the Farm where Scouting started.

Girls came into Scouting for the first time. We were very proud that in 2000 three of our Ventures achieved their Queen' Scout Award, the highest award in Scouting. On Saturday 2nd December 2000 Andrew Appleby, Peter Robinson and Graham Wells attended the Guildhall London where their Awards were presented by The Chief Scout George Purdy.

All Venture units were disbanded in 2002 when the age groups in Scouting were changed.

Now we have a very strong group with Beavers (6 to 8yrs), Cubs (8 to 10 1/2), Scouts (10 1/2 to 14) and the new section Explorers (14 to 18)

The group camped at Elton Guide campsite the week of 28th July- Aug 2nd to celebrate 100 years of scouting with the rest of Newark District Scouts.
