ON THE BEAT WITH PCSO 8128 MIKE MUNRO

This month I have a question for you.

How many people are exactly the same as you? The same name, the same passport except for the photo or the same credit card number. I'm talking about identity theft.

In the UK it is estimated that more than 67,406 people were victims of identity theft in 2006 and the last official estimate put the cost of identity theft at 1.7 Billion pounds according to Home Office study.

How to Spot Identity Fraud/Theft

Victims of identity theft often do not realise their identity has been stolen until it is too late. Here are some useful tips to help spot identity fraud as soon as it happens:

- □ Card statements or bills arrive late or not at all.
- □ Unusual transactions appear on your credit cards, bank statements or credit file.

 $\hfill\square$ Companies contact you about new accounts or services about which you have no knowledge.

 \Box You are unexpectedly refused credit cards or store cards.

So how can we try and protect ourselves.

- □ Be careful whom you give your personal details too.
- Keep personal documents safe in your home; do not leave them out on display. Consider purchasing a safe for documents such as passports and drivers licences.
- □ If you suspect your mail has been stolen, report it to Royal Mail immediately.
- □ Have bank statements delivered <u>monthly</u> and always check for unfamiliar transactions.
- □ When giving personal information out such as card details ensure that you cannot be overheard.
- □ Do not write down your bank pin number, it is easy to change the number to one you can remember.
- □ When using cash machines be aware of places where a miniature camera can be placed. They are about the size of a ten pence piece.
- □ Shred or destroy personal documents you are throwing away.
- □ Ensure your home computer is protected with a good anti-virus, firewall and anti-spam software package before you go online.
- □ When moving House tell your bank, card issuer and of course all other organisations that you deal with immediately and notify the Royal Mail to redirect any mail from your old address to your new one for at least a year.
- ☐ If you think you may have become a victim then contact all the relevant companies i.e. banks, credit card companies and notify other creditors with whom you have acc



Our churchyard is looking good! We have recently advertised for people to help with the maintenance of our church yard. As a result, we now have a group of people cutting the grass, clearing the headstones of ivy and other unwanted plants, and a tree surgeon is working on the yew trees. We cannot express enough how important this work is. A big thank you to everyone who has undertaken these tasks, your help is very much appreciated – please keep up the good work. Coddington History Group last did a survey of the gravestones in the church yard in 2006. Our aim is to MAP each and every gravestone. If you would like to become involved, again please ring Shelia. Only this week we have had two requests to locate family burial areas, one couple came from Victoria in Australia

GRAVESTONE MAINTENANCE

If you have family buried in the churchyard, do you realise that it is your responsibility for maintenance of the plot, and in particular the safety of the headstone. We would like to point out that over the past week three headstones were found to be unsafe and have had to be laid down.

Regulations issued by the Diocese are quite strict in terms of safety, and over the next few months a full survey will be done to identify those headstones which the PCC consider to be unsafe. The families will be contacted and they will need to follow set procedures to make them safe.

NEWARK TEAM MINISTRY PROPOSAL

Following initial discussions, it is proposed that All Saints' Church, Coddington, will become part of the Newark Team Ministry in 2009. It will become the fourth church in the Team – in addition to Christ Church, St Leonard's and St Mary Magdalene. The Pastoral Scheme, which facilitates this aim, is proceeding well. Following the retirement of the Revd Pauline Hutchinson of St Leonard's in January 2009, a new post for a Team Vicar is soon to be advertised, with interviews taking place in December 2008. This priest will have pastoral responsibility for both St Leonard's and All Saints' Coddington.

Coddington church will continue to operate as we always have done with our own District Church Council and we will remain responsible for our own finances.







Winthorpe & Coddington Tigers FC was formed in 1998 by parents from the 2 primary schools at Winthorpe & Coddington to provide under 8s and under 9s with an opportunity to play football in the newly formed Newark Youth league. 10 years later the club has grown from 1 team of combined under 8s & 9s to become one of the biggest and best clubs in the area providing opportunities for Under 8s through to under 16s with 9 teams in all. The club has been successful over the years with 5 league championships at various age groups, numerous cup competitions wins and a reputation for small summer competitions wins to envy all other teams.

The club has excellent facilities for training and competitions, playing out of Winthorpe community centre for under 8s & 9s and Stapleford Lane, Coddington (A17 roundabout) for under 10s to 16s. CODDINGTON HISTORY GROUP

Donald James Walster

Born 08.11.1921 Died 09.07.1993 His nieces & nephew took his Ashes to be scattered at the SAS Regiment in Hereford on the 29.07.1993

Don was educated at Coddington School and the Grammar School in Newark. He became a joiner like his father.

He joined up a week before the war when he was seventeen (he lied about his age but was determined to join the forces) and joined the Sherwood Rangers (no.557905). Previously, he had been in the Territorials. He was made up to Corporal before they left for France this was the first time he had travelled abroad. They travelled to Marseilles by train and took eight hundred horses. Many of the horses suffered during the journey and several of them died. The regiment was shipped across to Palestine although they didn't see any fighting there. He saw Jerusalem and Galilee. By this time, he was the most senior corporal in his unit but he wasn't promoted because of his age.

He heard that they were recruiting for the SAS and volunteered. He joined *Dett* 1st SAS Regiment at Kabrit, Egypt. He had to drop rank to trooper but that didn't bother him and his training began at Bitter Lakes at Kabrit. Part of his training was unarmed combat, desert survival, attaching bombs to underside of ships & tanks etc and parachuting. He parachuted a number of times behind enemy lines.

He served under the command of David Stirling; they lived in the desert for months at a time mostly in the Qatari Depression. Don went many raids the "Malta Convoy Raids", he also went on many raids inside German held Territory. He was on the Benghazi raid and took a bullet. He was taken prisoner at the same time as Col. Stirling during the final push up the desert near Tripoli. They were taken to an Italian compound where he and other SAS were beaten and some killed. They were then taken to German headquarters where Rommel was in command. The order from Berlin was that all captured SAS were to be executed Rommel fortunately disobeyed the order. They were moved out of Tripoli and shipped to a prisoner of war camp outside of Capua. He was then taken by truck into Germany to Dachau where he spent ten months of hell. He was then sent to another prisoner of war

camp at Lamsdorf. When the Russian advance drew nearer, the men were given two days warning that they were marching west as were thousands of other prisoners. Eventually they arrived at Gorlitz near Hanover and were rescued by the allies, taken to a Belgian airport and flown back home. During his service abroad of six years and 186 days he had served in Palestine (19-1-40 to 1-10-40), Cyprus (2-10-40 to 13-1-41), Egypt (14-1-41 to 26-1-41), Crete (27-1-41 to 31-5-41), Egypt (1-6-41 to 16-12-42) Libya, Italy & Germany (POW)(17-12-42 to 20-4-45) and received two medals (The King George VI 1939 – 1945 Star & The Africa Star).

Don was in poor state of health by this time having been beaten, starved, travelled in cattle trucks with eighty-six men other men, made to dig out mass graves, walk for miles & miles in feet of snow and ice, and starved again. By now he was attached to the Royal Armoured Corps.

The army classified him as 'Ceasing to fulfil Army Physical Requirements' and he was finally invalided out in March 1946 with a disability pension of £2 a week. The pension continued for two years! On his discharge Certificate his military Conduct was stated as Exemplary.

It took him almost a year to get well enough to work again and he decided to start his own painting and decorating business with his father to help him. Donald and his father did all the joinery work on the village hall (Coronation Hall) when it was built in the early fifties. Years later he launched his own taxi service and eventually worked in the car industry at Wadham Stringer until he retired.

He married Kathleen Mavis Burton in July 1947 at St. Mary Magdalene church in Newark. Kathleen died April 1989. There were no children...

He and Kathleen lived most of their married life at One Ash, Newark Road, Coddington with George & Ruth until both his parents died. All his businesses were run from there. He enjoyed playing whist and regularly went to Whist Drives at the Sergeants Mess, RAF Winthorpe. (Site of the now Beaconfield Drive). At one time he owned a racehorse and also a greyhound. He and Kathleen had a keen interest in tennis and belonged to the Newark Tennis Club on Sherwood Avenue. In the 1960's, Donald and Kathleen also helped the Conservative Party and Kathleen worked for the Newark Constituency.

Donald & Kathleen moved to Balderton in the early 1970's, firstly to Brisbane Court and after Kathleen died in 1989, he moved to Gibson Crescent until his death on the 9th July 1993.

His funeral service took place at St. Giles church; Balderton and he had a guard of Honour from members of the Newark branch of the British Legion.

The details above relating to his time serving with the SAS were taken from his own memoirs .Don's Goddaughter Barbara Horton wrote this article.

HISTORY GROUP REPORT

The first 5 Years

It is now 5 years since we applied for and got the Local Heritage Initiative Grant to collect the history of our village.

We started off with none of the necessary equipment, so the first part of the grant was spent on a Digital SLR Camera, A3 scanner, O.S Maps followed by Display stands. Our major project at this time was the Trail Map, the cost of which was approx £1,930. This was delivered free to every house in the Parish.

During 2004, the Web site was being researched and then, at an initial cost of £499.38, was up and running.

After the first exhibition we realised that we required more display boards, we now have 10, which are used by other Groups to display relevant history i.e. Church, Parish council.

During this phase of the grant we started to attend various courses that were designated under the terms of the award.

With the second half of the Grant we set about producing the book "Views of Coddington" given to all households in the parish, which cost £3,050, and the Zoobooco Cube, costing £2,566.82, showing scenes of Coddington and given to all children at Coddington Primary School.

At this time we bought a laptop, projector, sound equipment and screen so that we can show films put together by our members. The cost of adding extras to the web site was also carried in this period.

All through this time we have scanned, recorded, and archived all the information given to the group, photo's, family trees, oral history, history found at Nottingham Archives and house deeds (a very valuable source of history)

We shall carry on inviting guest speakers to the Village Hall as these have to be self- funding, that being the reason that we make a small charge and run a raffle.

Much archived material can be found in our library of books and we are often asked to help with research into family trees.

We shall carry on collecting, collating and preserving all the history of the village, although we no longer have the grant to support the group.
