BUS STOP REPORT.

There has been another meeting with the relevant authorities with regard to the siting of the bus stop opposite the Post Office. It has been suggested by those present that the bus stop be moved around the corner towards the slip road of the A1. This site is the nearest to the original stop and has the advantage that a shelter will also be installed. There will probably be a small lay-by included if the bus company think this would help safety matters.

Other sites that were suggested had no provision for a shelter or were much further away from the shop. The Parish Council are asking for public opinion as to the new site.

A final decision will be taken in 6 months which gives time for the bus drivers and ourselves to express our views.

Revd David Anderton, the Team Vicar writes...

Hello! As I write I have been in post just two weeks, and may I start by saying a big thank you for the warm welcome we have received. The 'we' I speak of are Emma, my wife, Martha our daughter who is 3 ½ and myself. Thank you to those who were able to be at the service of welcome at All Saints' Church on my first Monday morning. It was especially good to see Mr Daykin there with some of the students from Coddington Primary School and I look forward to the continuing

development of the links between school and church. Thanks too if you were able to be at my Licensing Service that evening at St Mary Magdalene's Church. I have had many comments on what a wonderful atmosphere there was – and of course thank you to all who were involved in the catering for the evening, it was a fantastic spread. I firmly believe that sharing food and drink together is an important part of our Christian heritage. In the gospels we often find Jesus sharing a meal with his followers at the most profound points of his earthly ministry, and as an ex-Dietitian I am well aware of the importance to our well being of what - and the way - we eat and drink!

But Jesus tells us that physical food is not enough to keep a human being healthy. We are Spiritual beings too, and it is important that we eat and drink of the Spiritual food that God provides for us, and I hope to write more of that in future issues.



PARISH SURGERY

The Coddington Parish Surgery is held in church between 7.30pm and 8.30 pm on the 1st and 3rd Friday of each month. GRAVESTONE MAINTENANCE

If you have family buried in the churchyard, do you realise that it is your responsibility for maintenance of the plot, and in particular the safety of the headstone.

Regulations issued by the Diocese are quite strict in terms of safety, and over the next few months a full survey will be done to identify those headstones which the PCC consider to be unsafe. The families will be contacted and they will need to follow set procedures to make them safe.

LICENSING OF OUR NEW TEAM VICAR

The Licensing of our new Team Vicar Reverend David Anderton took place on 27th April. At 9.00 am he attended a short service at Coddington church where he was handed the keys, and the inventory. After a short service at the font, the lectern and the altar, a cake was shared among all present as a sign of breaking and sharing at communion. His licensing took place at St Mary's church at 7.00 pm, where he was licensed by Bishop George and installed by our Archdeacon. The service was attended by guests from both our churches, and from Hucknall, David's former parish. Thanks to all those who helped with the catering and assisted on the night. We had many favourable comments on the quality of the catering, and a good time was had by all. We would like to give a warm welcome to David, his wife Emma, and their daughter Martha.

CHURCH OF ENGLAND CHILDREN'S SOCIETY

CODDINGTON HISTORY GROUP

Ernest Bryan MM

My father Ernest Bryan died suddenly in 1966, an ordinary man, but a much-loved husband, father and grandfather who died before his time. My daughter was too young to have known him as she was only one and a half years old when he died, but I kept his medals, determined to show them to her when she was old enough to understand.

Ernest Bryan was born and spent most of his early youth in Coddington, a small village near Newark in Nottinghamshire. His parents, Robert, an agricultural labourer and his wife Annie Marshall had a small cottage on the Green and he lived there with his brothers and sisters until 1915, when he was only 16 years old he lied about his age and joined the army to fight the Kaiser.

He, along with millions of other ordinary men were persuaded by clever propaganda or just by the desire to protect their country, to go overseas and fight a formidable foe. He joined the 8th Battalion of the Royal Lancaster Regiment and went to the Front.

There are only two British men alive today who fought in the Great War and soon there will be none and that awful conflict will then fall out of living memory. Recently, therefore, I was determined to try and find out what my father did in that War because this ordinary man did something extraordinary, he won the Military Medal for gallantry.

As with thousands of others who survived the Great War, my father was reluctant to talk about his experiences and although he showed me his medals, he didn't go into any great detail about what he did to win the Military Medal, except in the far recesses of my memory I recall something about "going into no-man's land and bringing back a fallen Officer to our lines". This may have been a true memory, but I'm not sure and, of course, there is no one I can ask.

Unfortunately, after much research, I have been unable to find a citation. In the London Gazette Supplement dated 24th January 1919, his name - 41078 Pte. Bryan, E., 8th Bn. (Newark) - was included in the list of awards. Citations in the London Gazette were

usually given for Officers not unlisted men, so if there was a written citation given personally to my father, it has been lost. I have even traced and have a copy of the Royal Lancaster regimental war diary for the period he was at the Front, but his name wasn't mentioned. Officers' names are catalogued, but not unlisted men.

My father was wounded, possibly in the action that saved the Officer. He was sent to a hospital where as part of his convalescence he embroidered the regimental badge of the Sherwood Foresters, Notts and Derby on black velvet, and I also have that. I'm not sure why he would embroider the Sherwood Foresters badge when he was in the Royal Lancasters, but perhaps someone out there might know!

After the war he returned to Coddington and worked for a timber merchants. His work took him around the Nottinghamshire, Yorkshire and Norfolk areas and he subsequently met my mother in Doncaster. They married at Darrington, Pontefract in the Parish of Womersley in a private chapel, owned, we think, by Col. Acland-Hood and spent their early-married life in a horse-drawn caravan to enable them to move easily from place to place for his work. My brother, Robert was born in 1925 and five years later in 1930 I arrived! When I was two years old we moved out of the caravan and into a house in Worksop, where my father spent the rest of his working life as a timber leader for the same company, Godley and Goulding. We were a close family, spending time together watching and taking part in sports, particularly cricket.

My brother Robert sadly died in 1980, but the Bryans live on with his children, Kevin, Andrew and Denise.

I have one child, Samantha, who will eventually have his medals and in turn will give them to her son, Miles, who will learn about his great grandfather from her - an ordinary man who did something extraordinary.
