This Month is all about Our Policing Pledge and you.

The Policing Pledge is a set of promises to you. It includes a commitment to making sure you know how to contact your local neighbourhood policing officers and gives communities the chance to tell us what they think is important.

It contains clear standards for all forces and lets you know the level of service you should expect from us.

At Nottinghamshire Police, our business is to help make the county a safer, better place to live, work and visit, and we do this in partnership with other organizations and local communities.

### **Protect and Reassure**

We are striving to meet the Pledge in a number of ways-from making our local beat teams more visible and accessible to improving the service offered by our call handlers when people dial 999.

Our overall aim is to protect and reassure you, giving you greater confidence in the service we provide.

We are dedicated to making sure local people have a voice, so we've signed up to the national Policing Pledge.

### We will:

- 1) Always treat you fairly and give you access to our services at a time that is reasonable and suitable for you.
- 2) Make sure you know how to contact and work with your neighbourhood policing officers.
- 3) Ensure there are visible patrols in your community.
- **4)** Respond to every message directed to your neighbourhood policing officers within 24 hours.
- 5) Answer 999 calls in under 10 seconds and safely attend to emergencies within 15 minutes in urban areas, or 20 minutes in rural are
- as.6) Answer all non-emergency calls promptly and attend to priorities or those who are vulnerable or upset within 60 minutes. Alternatively, we can make an appointment to see you at a time that suits you.
- 7) Hold regular public meetings to agree your priorities. Find out how to get involved by visiting <a href="www.nottinghamshire.police.uk">www.nottinghamshire.police.uk</a> and typing in your post-code on the homepage.
- 8) Provide monthly updates on progress, and on local crime and policing issues.
- 9) If you have been a victim of crime agree with you how often you would like to be kept informed.
- **10)** Acknowledge any dissatisfaction with the service you have received within 24 hours and discuss with you how it will be handled.

If we don't keep our pledge, we'll explain why.


# **Memories of Coddington' Calendar 2010**





# **CODDINGTON HISTORY GROUP**

Our season of open meetings began with a well presented and most interesting illustrated talk by professional geneaologist John Titford entitled "Looking for Mrs Williamson". Taking a break from writing for family history magazines and lecturing on cruise ships (well, I suppose someone has to do it!) he showed us a handwritten, calfskin bound book dating from around 1850 which he had bought; it had no title page nor clues as to its purpose save for the written contents and a few letters enclosed that were from a Mrs Williamson. The writing was in short paragraphs and described people who were looking for work as servants. Showing us how he had pieced together the story, we found out that the book was the record kept by Mrs W. for her Staff Agency in Derby – the successor of which is still in business today and is the longest running such agency. It was a fascinating story with plenty of useful information for both family and local history researchers.

Our October talk was by Kevin Harrison, a local Blue Badge guide who has given us talks before. He is able to absorb an enviably large number of facts and give them back to us both without notes and with plenty of entertainment; this time he led us on a gallop through all the Kings and Queens of England since 1066 – with an appropriate amount of gossip and scandal thrown in!

We have just had a reprint of our Coddington Heritage Trail leaflet so for those who have lost their original or have moved into the village since we distributed them it is now available again from us. It is also available to download at <a href="https://www.coddington.org.uk">www.coddington.org.uk</a>.

We have also begun recording the buildings at Sunnyside Farm – the most complete set of old farm buildings still in the village, there will also be a display about this next April. Our thanks are due to John Kirton and Mavis Kirton for allowing us access to the farm.

Our next project is to create some themed photograph albums using some of the thousands of images in our collection; they will be available for viewing at our open day on 24<sup>th</sup> April next year – more details when we have them.

I hope we will be able to welcome some of you to one of our talks.

### **CODDINGTON HISTORY GROUP**

Recitation and Victorian Songs – for Christmas and other Occasions Songs, Concerts, High-Days and Holidays at Coddington School 1870 – 1900

Rolf Vernon (a local historian who once lived at Moat Edge on Balderton Lane) used the school log-book to write an account of 'Coddington School in the Victorian Age', published in 1987. These extracts remind us that songs, concerts, treats and holidays featured in school life alongside rote-learning, inspection visits, truancy and staffing difficulties.

John Roberts, the headmaster's entry for 1872 was brief:

'The school had a half holiday on 26th April when the Yeomanry visited "Beaconfield" (as Coddington Hall was called then). 'May 14th Holiday for May Fair at Newark. August 2nd Children taken to Stapleford Wood in wagons lent by farmers. November 12th and 13th holiday for Coddington village feast.'

During 'Harvest Holiday' (as the long school closure in August and September was known) the older children would work in the fields. They might also be absent without leave for potato picking, haymaking, turnip singling or pea pulling or simply looking after their siblings whilst their mother worked. Christmas holidays would usually last about 10 days, with a 'children's school treat' day in early January. Spring brought a number of day or half-day holidays, including Newark's May Fair, the Friendly Society 'Club Feast' day and Coddington Flower Show in July.

John Roberts records on Jan24th, 1878 an official inspection by Mr J Barrington Ward M.A, and underneath adds: 'List of School Songs'

"Boyhood – Boat" Song – "Try Again"

"Holiday Song" – "Plough Boy" – "The Swing" – "Don't Kill the Birds" – "Pet Lamb".

In 1880 a law was passed making school attendance compulsory. In 1883 the Managers replaced John Roberts with a new young headmaster, Mr Chauntry Hunt.

1885 During November and also in December, there was a great deal of illness and there were therefore many absences, but that fact was not allowed to interfere with a new venture; this was a Concert to be held on the evening of 22nd December. There was a half holiday on that day so the final preparations could be made. As a result of the concert £1- 12s-6d was raised for another innovation – the Prize Fund. (Headmaster) Chauntry Hunt was certainly showing initiative in widening his school's activities

1886, on 11<sup>th</sup> November there was a 'Children's Entertainment and Prize Distribution'. There were songs, part-songs and recitations. ... At the end of December, a half holiday preceded the second Children's Concert. The entertainments included part-songs, action songs, musical drill and a sketch, raising 35 shillings for the 'Day School Prize Fund'.

The 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Children's Entertainment in 1889 was so enjoyable that it raised £3-3s-0d and by request, the programme was repeated on the evening

of 20<sup>th</sup> December. During the interval at the 6<sup>th</sup> Concert the 'senior scholar', Fountain Picksley, presented a 'handsome album' to Mr Chauntry Hunt on behalf of the two top classes 'for his kindness to them'. Mrs Thorpe presented the prizes at the 7th Concert in early January 1892 and the new Vicar, Rev C P Smith, distributed the prizes in January 1893 at the 8th concert, before a crowded audience.

On 21<sup>st</sup> December 1893 the 9th Annual Children's Concert was held in the new Schoolroom, which had just been completed and had not been used before. Into the log-book was gummed part of an elegantly printed programme. On it can be seen 46 names of the boys and girls who had been the best attenders in 1893. By carefully raising the sheet, Vernon was able to read some of the names of the performers: Ethel Mettham gave a recitation 'The Naughty Dolly; Susannah Mayfield sang 'The Worst Girl in the School'; E Hunt, F Backhouse and A Crawford gave a 'dialogue' called 'A Recitation Contest'.

After April 1895 the school became the only one in the village, with the closure of the Methodist Day School. On the 11<sup>th</sup>June 1896 Mr Bruce Webster conducted the school inspection, reporting that 'songs were rendered with taste and sweetness'. ... On 22<sup>nd</sup> July there was a half-holiday for the 'Annual Picnic of the Band of Hope' (the first mention of the Band of Hope in the log-book). The following week there was a whole holiday for Coddington Flower Show 'at which eighteen children took part in 'the plaiting of the maypole' (a first mention of the maypole). For the Annual Flower Show In 1898 24 of the children repeated their exhibition of 'Maypole Plaiting'.

1897 On 18th and 19th February 'The Tenth Children's Concert' was given (no longer an annual event) but Mr Hunt reported that it was 'an extraordinary success. The 'large room was crowded to excess' The proceeds went towards providing 'lighting for the large room'. On Shrove Tuesday there was tea and 'two hours of amusement' for the 90 children who had taken part.

For Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee Celebrations the school closed from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> June 1897. The village was 'beautifully decorated throughout'. The festivities began at 2pm with the 'Mens Treat'. At 3pm the children assembled at the school where medals were given to them by Mrs G Tallents, after which they formed a procession, and headed by the Newark Yeomanry Band, they marched to Colonel Thorpe's barn for tea. Afterwards races and amusements of various kinds were enjoyed on the Cricket Ground and at half-past nine each child received a bun and lemonade. Hunt wrote: 'The whole treat was most enjoyable to all whether old or young and will be a pleasant memory for many years to come.' There were many disruptions to teaching that summer. On 5<sup>th</sup> July there was a half holiday for the Wesleyan Sunday School Treat in the village and on 23<sup>rd</sup> July another for the Band of Hope gave a treat in the

village. On the 29<sup>th</sup> July the school was closed for the day because of Coddington Flower Show; then came bank holiday (half a day only) followed not much later, on 5<sup>th</sup> August, by a whole day's holiday for the Church Sunday School Treat at Barnby! On 13<sup>th</sup> August Mr Hunt described school attendances over that 5—week period as 'simply deplorable'.

Summer 1898 brought a similar round of dissipation: 21st July Annual Flower Show with 'Maypole Plaiting, then the August Bank Holiday and a few days later the school was closed for half a day for a Primrose League Gathering in the village, and finally the School Treat on 9th August. 'Tea was provided in the school-room for mothers and their children - afterwards there was a wagon-ride round Barnby and sports at Coddington Vicarage.'

After a week's holiday for Christmas school restarted on 3<sup>rd</sup> January 1899 and Mr Hunt reported 'Extremely good attendance. Children fresh and bright with their holiday.' The 'Eleventh Children's Concert on 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> January was a 'great success with the room crowded on both evenings.' The proceeds were allocated 'to provide a new cupboard for the upper-room.' In February there was a Band of Hope treat for the village children, which started with tea at four o'clock. ... After two days of holiday for Good Friday and the bank Holiday, school restarted to find that there were to be staff changes. The assistant mistress, Mrs Draper, had resigned and Harriet Farmer was appointed in her place. A new monitress came to the Infant Department to join Harriett Booth – it was Elizabeth Gomer. Miss Gomer (who lived at Almond Cottage on Newark Rd) was to serve as school teacher for most of the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, and is still vividly remembered by her former pupils today.

On 30th June 1899 Colonel Thorpe made probably his last visits to the school, a few months before he died. As a long standing School Manager he had provided much support for the school and many teas, outings or treats for the children. Coddington Village Feast seemed to be fading in importance – the children were only given a half-day's holiday, compared with two and a half days in the early 1870s.

Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> April 2010, John Tallents - The Tallents family of Coddington House.

The Tallents scarcely need an introduction; important residents in Coddington and solicitors in Newark for many years. John has fascinating photos and stories to tell us.

Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> May 2010; Tina Lee – Crime and Punishment in Medieval times. This promises to be an interesting topic – I suspect we would not enjoy the punishments!
