## **ANNUAL GOLDEN GARDEN COMPETITION**

First of all, many thanks to last year's winners for doing the judging: - David Calvert, Barbara Horton and Joyce Storer.

We restrict ourselves to front gardens in the main part of the village unless specifically asked to venture into the outskirts as it is simply too much walking to go everywhere.

We managed to choose a good morning for our walk, not too hot nor raining and as usual there was a good selection to choose from although disappointingly nobody entered their back/hidden garden – such a shame as I am sure there are many excellent back gardens if the front gardens are anything to go by. This especially applies to the Thorpe Oaks estate since their front gardens are so small.

After much debate the judges decided to award the three equal prizes to:

3 Parklands Close – modest sized garden with interesting planting,  
12 Morgan's Close – quite a large front garden with grass and plenty of planting to keep the interest for much of the year,  
15 Bristol Close – by far the smallest of the winners but it has been kept consistently good for quite some time and this year was even better.

Special mention must be made of a few others; Bristol Close must have a small enclave of gardeners since there are three together that obviously take care, 43 Newark Road (Enfin) has a lovely display of pots that surely need a lot of care and attention, 7 Morgan's Close also took the judge's eye as did 19 and 21 Parkes Close, 14 Lancaster Road, and 18 Penswick Gardens.

The presentation of the awards which are sponsored by the Parish Council will be at their September meeting.

## ALL SAINTS' CHURCH CODDINGTON

I wonder what your experience of Church has been. Perhaps you have been a regular attendee of the same church throughout your life. Perhaps you were taken along as a child, but since being able to make your own choices you've rarely attended a church, only at special festivals or for baptisms, weddings and funerals. Perhaps you've dipped in and out of various churches. Perhaps you can't ever remember going to church at all.

Perhaps there have been times when you turned to a church in need and you found the support and care you were looking for, or perhaps there have been times when you felt let down by the church.

Maybe you ask the question what is church all about? Is it about the building or the people? Maybe you rarely give the church a second thought.

What the church should be about first and foremost is the worship of God. And when I say worship, I want to challenge our concept of what worship is. It isn't just about meeting in a building on a Sunday for an hour or so to sing hymns and say prayers. In the Gospels, Jesus makes it clear that worshipping God is about our whole lives. It is about our attitudes not only to God, but to other people, whoever they are, where ever they are. It is about our attitudes to money and possessions and to how we spend our time. It is about how we use the gifts and talents that God has given us.

In this coming autumn we at All Saints' would like to welcome you back to church if you haven't been for a while. I'd like to point out some particular services that are happening. **Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> September** is '**Back to Church Sunday**' and we are trying something new '**All Saints' at the Community Centre**' at 4pm. This will be a more informal style of worship with something for all the family. For those who prefer the more traditional there will be our usual **6pm service of Evening Prayer in church** too. **Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> October** will be our **Harvest Festival** and we will celebrate with a service for all the family at 4pm in church. And on **Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> October** at our 6pm service we will have the chance to remember the loved ones who've shared our lives but who we see no more. If you wish to have a loved one's name read out at that service please let either myself or Sheila Bache know.

Finally, may I commend to you the people of Pakistan suffering from the floods and in worship of God ask you to help in anyway you can.

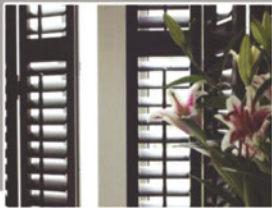

 **Blue Yonder** (Thu 23 Sep) – When Nazis invade their homeland, Czech pilots battle through Poland to reach England and fight in the Battle of Britain. Showing to mark the 70th anniversary of the battle.

 **The Other Boleyn Girl** (Thu 28 Oct) is demure Mary (Scarlett Johansson) who gives Henry VIII (Eric Bana) his first son while scheming sister Anne (Natalie Portman) plots to replace stoic Catherine of Aragon (Ana Torrent). Plus Mark Rylance as their ambitious father.

 **Invictus** (Thu 25 Nov) is the poem with the lines: “I am the master of my fate; I am the captain of my soul” that gave imprisoned Nelson Mandela (Morgan Freeman) hope on Robben Island and inspired Springbok captain Francois Pienaar (Matt Damon) during the 1995 Rugby World Cup in South Africa, which Mandela used to reconcile his divided nation. Director Clint Eastwood weaves their stories into a heartwarming drama.

The films are shown on a 10ft-wide screen, which, in the Village Hall, means it is a Really Big Screen. Our projector is electronic rather than mechanical so, while its fan hums a bit, you don't get all the clattering that comes with a standard cinema projector.

Because this is a public performance of a DVD, it costs more than ten times as much as borrowing from Blockbuster to watch at home. ## GP TRAINING IN COLLINGHAM

Collingham has been a training practice for over twenty years now. We pride ourselves on providing quality training, not only for doctors wishing to become GPs but also for medical students and district nursing students. Next year the pharmacy will be taking on a pre-reg pharmacist for our first one year placement.

As with many things in general practice, GP training is changing. Previously, doctors needed to pass something called Summative Assessment to qualify as a GP and, if they wished, they could also sit the exam for the membership of the Royal College of General Practitioners (MRCGP), which was considered the gold standard. Recently these two hurdles have been combined, as there was a growing body of opinion at having two systems was nonsense. The new requirement to qualify as a GP is known as the new MRCGP (nMRCGP). This consists of two exams, the AKT (applied knowledge test) and the CSA (clinical skills assessment). The AKT is a written exam and tests the candidate's medical knowledge and as its name suggests, the CSA tests their clinical skills, including their communication skills. Another important requirement is the work place based assessment, which includes patient satisfaction questionnaires, appraisal by colleagues, assessments of their video consultations and case based discussions with their trainer. This will take three years but there is a move afoot to extend GP training to five years. Time spent in practice has recently been increased from twelve months to sixteen months and in some parts of the country this is now twenty months.

On a practice level we currently have one GP trainer (Dr Terrill) and Dr Lawrence is soon also to become a trainer. This will mean that we will always have at least two Registrars with us but on occasions we may have as many as four, as Registrars are spending more of their time based in General Practice. We appreciate that this sometimes impacts on our delivery of services, although we try our best not to let this happen. This can be particularly the case when we have a new Registrar with us who requires much more input from the experienced GPs in the practice. We hope that you agree with us that the training of good General Practitioners for the future is of paramount importance for both the local community and for the UK as a whole. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our patients for their support in helping us to train the GPs of the future.

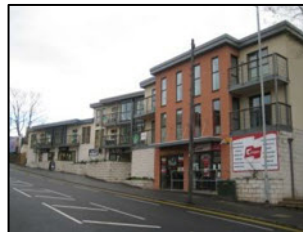

# CODDINGTON HISTORY GROUP

## Hand written notes by Godfrey Tallents 1

The living is a Vicarage, the net yearly value £290 in the gift of the Bishop of Southwell, and held by the Rev Charles Penswick Smith, A.K.C Loud Sim about 1891. The Vicarage is a new building built about 1872 on the Newark Road well stocked with trees, large garden and a good grass field.

The Feast is held on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of November where the Post Office is now it was once a Public House.

The Hill has been lowered all along the road, as can be seen all the length of the wall belong to Mr Tallents, but cannot find out the date when it was done.

Beacon Hill was lowered in the year 1827; most likely Coddington Hill was done at the same time.

There used to be a statute held here in May for one day but it died away some 50 years ago. I am told by an old inhabitant, there used to be Tom Fool shows and a lot of stalls, this was held where the guide post now stands, and stalls by the side of the road on Bunkers Hill, opposite, my informant tells me their used to be a lot of drinking. Also a lot of fighting, which used to take place in the first field now occupied by Mr. Parkes. On these occasions the Constable had plenty of work. Also wrestling at the Plough Inn paddock.

Thornton says their used to be a **famous horse race** held here on the Moor, Stapleford Lane End of which the Mayor of Newark and Alderman of Newark were accustomed to provide the plate. But got down to Donkey races about 1862 to 1870. P.s. the Mayor and Corporation used to attend the races in state.

A reading room was erected by the late Col. James Thorpe and there is a village library of about 100 vols. Supported by the Esquire, aided by a bequest from the late Mrs Deeping of Newark.

The Wesleyan and Methodists have a place of worship here erected in 1865 with schoolroom adjoining, for 130 children the school received £20:00 per quarter from Birches Charity, now closed but used as a Sunday school.

Ordoyno Family – “ **Flora Nottingamiensis**” plants growing naturally in the County of Nottinghamshire. By Thomas Ordoyno, Newark 1807. See tablets in the church Ordoyno dole see vicar.

The soil is clayey to the west and gravelly to the east, subsoil, blue lias stone, marl and gravel. The area is 1,900 acres, rateable value £2,674. Population 5 to 600. Crops grown chiefly corn & roots. There is a Post Office and telephone to Newark.

Mr. James Thorpe, the elder, of Beaconfield Hall (since called Coddington Hall) was twice Mayor of Newark in 1832 and 1835; his too early death was a signal loss to the town.

### **Duckey Lane** (*Chapel Lane*)

It received its name from the fact; a Coddington man stole some ducks, and was found in this lane pulling out some feathers, when alive. This man Robert Town lived in a house now pulled down facing Walster's stack yard as was occupied by Mr. S. Parkes as a gardener for years, which belonged to the late G. Ordoyno. The late Colonel Thorpe bought Ordoyno's farm and house which he had pulled down and built a nice house for his mother, it now belongs to Mrs Tallents and when it was taken over Parkes's garden was enclosed as a part of the plan.

This Robert Town was a man very fond of beer and was such a glutton; he would drink half a gallon at a time, and not being very fond of work, what money he could get was spent in drink.

Coddington Cross, stood where the guide post now stands, the remains of the Cross was taken down about ?. Some of its stones are still about the village. The stone at the stocks is one, two large steps at the lace cottages, and at Mr. Ross's corner, we find some more with ends stuck in the ground, there was a large round stone, no doubt got used for some purpose and out of sight, with others.

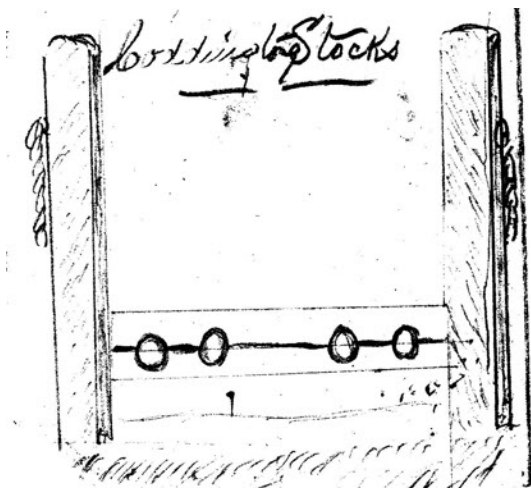
The mention of the Cross-in history have I found. P.s. the old Cross-was standing after 1811.

In the year 1801 the price of bread was 1/10d per quarter loaf.

### **CODDINGTON STOCKS**

The old Stocks at Coddington were in the pinfold and situated by the side of the road on the turn to Beckingham, now nothing remains of

this public punishment of by gone days, but the grass on which children now play, a post and a large stone, to mark the spot. The size of the stocks, would hold two prisoners, there was also chains fastened to the posts, for the parish Constable to handcuff prisoners too.



In 1840 or about new-posts were erected, and in the following night sawn down by some one unseen, but it was supposed, the work was done by one Harry Burton a joiner of this village a notorious person, who lived in the house now occupied by village police man.

The Stocks had Bow staples with locks hands across.

Coddington Hall is this residence of Capt.

J.S.Thorpe JP is pleasantly situated, over looking a large Park well stocked with a fine heard of Red cattle, the gardens are very nice but not large, the pleasure gardens have been recently improved and enlarged with a fine fountain and laid out after the Italian style. Capt. Thorpe is the Esquire of Coddington, and also lay Rector of the church (by the farm now in occupation Mr C Daybell which is called the Rectory farm and is the property of the Captain) to keep the fabric in good order in the chancel.

The Duke of Newcastle is lord of the manor.

The principal landowners are Capt. J S Thorpe J P. who is the owner of nearly the whole of the Parish and Mrs Young who owns her own farm and some cottages together with a shop also the Public House known by The Plough Inn.

The lime quarries also are on her land and have produced some very fine limestone for building purpose and the other kinds are burnt and produce very good lime for making mortar. The Kiln is not

in use now, the stone contains some fine Specimens (????) of fossils both ???? and ???? also specimens of the S???? been found.

The large room over the three cottages next to the Globe Inn originally used as work rooms for making of lace, but which kind of lace I am unable to make out, from what I can gather from an old inhabitant it would be about 1836 when the making of lace was discontinued, the proprietor was named Ashfield, and was built by him. Thornton says. The lordship is in several hands, two brothers of the name of Ashfield, have each portions. One a Dr. Ashfield lived at Waddington, the farm generally known as Manfleets farm and the one Mrs Morris resides did belong to the Ashfield's, and descendants of the same family are still in Nottingham, no doubt they might have been a Nottingham family, hence lace making. The Ashfield's were liming men at their time see grave stones dates back to 1677 & before.

In Balderton Lane on the right hand side before you reach the gravel pit you will see the old trenches used by the troops against Newark Jan1st 1644.

Colonel Thomas Grey quarters at Coddington. Colonel Roseter's quarters at Balderton. Colonel Henry Grey at Winthorpe.

March 21<sup>st</sup> 1643 Prince Rupert being a nephew of King Charles marched from Coddington with an army down Beacon Hill a mile short of Newark and fought a victorious battle with the enemy.

## BIG LUNCH IN BEACONSFIELD 2010



We had glorious sunshine instead of the rain of last year for our Big Lunch street party on Sunday 18 July of the residents of Beaconsfield Drive, Ordoyno Grove, Yew Tree Way and Orchard Park. Nearly all of the households came to the party on the grassy patch of common land opposite to where Coddington Hall once stood. Folk brought deck-chairs, drinks and picnics and shared them as people greeted their neighbours and said 'Hi. I've not seen you since last year but at least we've waved to each other driving past in our cars. How you doing?' There was a quiz for the 'younger residents' – "Who died in 1812 and his name was given to one of our roads nearly 200 years later?" Surprisingly few recognised an oak leaf printed on the sheet. These events have been suggested by the Eden Project of Cornwall and ours was one of thousands organised spontaneously around the country, described by the Project as: "A day when, for a few glorious hours, cars will stop, shyness will stop, gloom will stop and Britain will come together to meet, greet, share, swap, sing, play and laugh for no reason other than we all need to." The only singing we did was 'happy birthday' for one of our number – but everything else in the list happened. From start to finish it lasted over six hours.

It is a pity more small communities don't do likewise. According to the Big Lunch website we were the only event in Newark, while Lincoln, Mansfield, Nottingham had lots. All I did was put a leaflet through 41 doors (our double flap letter-boxes are difficult – especially when there is a dog barking inside!), put six placards around the estate and hanged some bunting across the site. What was great was that

spontaneously others cut the grass, scraped moss of the central patio, erected a gazebo, baked cakes, brought drinks and picnics – and came with their families.

A poster asked what our estate should be called. Suggestions were: Old Hall Manor, Beazer's Last Stand, Persimmon's Park, Mid-West Coddington, Thorpe Yews, Yobo Estate (the last being a mnemonic for Yew Tree Way, Ordoyno Grove, Beaconsfields Drive, Orchard Park). The voting was inconclusive so perhaps we should ask the Parish Council to think about naming us. Small communities need names in order to thrive.
