ANNUAL PARISH MEETING 16,4.85

CODDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL - CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Parish Council has continued to supply a rubbish skip at Valley View (approximately 3 per year). Nottinghamshire County Council did offer to do this for £10.00 per lift but found they could not continue the service. We therefore put the job out for tender and now use Cleanaway at £18.40 per lift. We have also agreed to supply 4 skips per year for Harvey Avenue with the same firm on the same basis - Priday to Monday.

We have erected a noticeboard at the entrance to Harvey Avenue Estate after requests going back 3 or 4 years. The cost was £84.00

We had a Casual Vacancy By-election, with Kr. J. Molloson being the successful candidate. Our congratulations go to Kr. Molloson.

After continual complaints about litter (mainly on the Nevark Road), the Parish Council decided to supply 12 litter bins around the village in the hope that this would solve the problem. These cost £188.83.

We sent £25.00 to the Mayor's Ethiopian Appeal and £10.00 to the Community Rights Project.

We have supplied some play equipment - 5-a-side goalposts for Thorpe Close at a total cost of £350.17, made up of £172.70 grant from Newark District Council and £45.67 VAT, making the final cost to the Parish Council £121.80. A junior slide for Harvey Avenue had a total cost of £664.12, made up of £346.50 grant from Newark District Council and £86.62 VAT, making the final cost to the Parish Council £231.00.

The Gravel Pit project was entered in the Village Venture Competition and was one of the 7 finalists. A grant of £40.00 has been obtained for equipment to maintain the project from the Notts Rural Community Council. A scythe and fork have been purchased for £24.91, the balance being with the Parish Council account for future requirements. Some of the trees died during the drought last year and have seen replaced. Thanks must go to Mr. & Mrs Page for their enthusiatic help with this landscaping scheme.

As everyone should know after having received one, we have launched the Coddington Community Newsletter. We would like to thank the Editor, Er. Jo Molloson, for his tremendous effort and determination. He has given endless time to this project and long may it continue to succeed. We have Mrs. Creed to thank for the typing and all the Councillors for distribution. We have not yet decided on the frequency of the CCN. This is forward for consideration in the near future.

It was pleasing to read letters from residents of the Harvey Avenue Estate in the coddington Community News, and these contacts we welcome. It would be helpful to have a representative from the Harvey Avenue Estate on the Parish Council.

In January this year, Ers. Storey was co-opted onto the Parish Council. Belcome Ers. Storey.

Now the bad news. We have lost our Clerk, Mrs. J. Allen (my daughter-in-law) to whom we owe a great deal of our success. Her skilful letter writing never sailed to get a co-operative response. I am sure we all appreciate this and convey our sincere thanks to her. Why did she leeve? Time will tell!

We have appointed krs. R. Tysoe as our new Cle.k who shows great enthusiasum for the job. I am sure, when she gets used to the various contacts, she will be an asset to the Village.

CODDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING NOTES: 16th April 1985

The modest turnout or Coddington's residents to their Annual Parish Reeting did not prevent the proceedings becoming both lively and informative.

Although we had to manage without County Councillor Mrs Yates, we were very pleased to see District Councillor Calvert at the top table.

First the routine business of the meeting was done. This included:

- 1. A report upon the healthy financial state of the Coddington United Charities Trust was received, whose duty it is to assist the poor and needy of the Parish. The Trust owns three bungalows for senior citizens and derives most of its income from rents from its agricultural land owned in the Parish.
- 2. Parish Council Chairman's report (see in this issue)
- 3. Accounts for the year ending 31st March 1985.
- 4. Future expenditure: similar to the past year, but the purchase of a bus shelter for Balderton Lane and the possibility of being involved in establishing a bowling green are to be considered.
- >. A report or the village Hall Charity Trust (see report in this issue).
- b. A short report from Cllr Mrs. Smith about the satisfactory performance of Coddington Primary School.
- 7. District Councillor Calvert explained how local Government finance was even more tightly controlled at present and how the District Council was having to respond to reducing resources by increasing their rates, despite careful economies at Kelham Hall.
- 8. The slowdown of the Council house modernisation programme at Earwey Avenue brought a lengthy discussion, stimulated by searching questions from the floor. Cllr Calvert promised to support residents and press for the modernisation to be speeded up.
- The Parish Council agreed to look into:
 The problem of dogs fouling public footpaths and open spaces.

 The widening of Valley View.

 A possible footbridge near the school over the A17 Sleaford Rd.

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES: 16th April and 22nd April 1985

Two sessions rollowed the Annual Parish Meeting and the main points were:-

- 1. RUBBISH DUMPING The District Council is to be pressed further to secure the clearance of rubbish from the government-owned land between Old Hail Gardens and Harvey Avenue.
- 2. HEAVY LORRIES An early site meeting is being arranged with the Highway Authority (Notts County Council) to show them the problems caused by heavy forries using Old Nowerk Rosd and Main Street instead of staying on the A17 Sleaford Road.

- 3. PROPOSED NEWARK BYPASS The County Council has told the Parish Council that providing all the legal processes are successfully completed and the Government authorizes finance, the long A46 A1 loop could commence contruction late 1986 and the 'Condington Bypass' between the northern A1/A46 junction and the A17 could be started mid-1987. The whole scheme could be completed by March 1988, so Condington will have to put up with the present A17's volume of traffic for at least another three years. (How many more deaths and injuries will have mounted up by then? Ed.)
- 4. PLAY ACTIVITIES QUESTICHNAIRE Cllr Krs Witham reported on the disappointing response to the Parish Council's play survey (see this issue).
- 5. NEW CLERI. TO THE PARISH COUNCIL Mrs. Tysoe's contract of employment was agreed by the Parish Council. She can be contacted at 'Little Surprise' Main Street, Coddington. Tel 79665.
- b. CODDINGTOR COMMUNITY NEWS CON's frquency, cost and future will be discussed at the next meeting of the Parish Council on the 21st Kay.
- 7. POSSIBLE BOWLING GREEN In response to interest shown, the Parish Council is gathering further information as to costs and general viability.
- b. <u>CODDINGTON VILLAGE HALL</u> After a lengthy discussion it was agreed to make a £50 donation towards the running costs of the Village Hall. It was noted that no P.C. financial assistance had been given towards the Village Hall during the past two years.
- 9. PUBLIC FOCTPATH WALKS The Parish Council will be walking the village footpaths on Sunday 19th May and 2nd June to inject their condition, the styles and the waymarks. Any problems will be reported to the County Council Footpaths Officer. Land owners are asked to check beforehand that the footpaths are passable.

Residents and friends are cordially invited to join your Parish Councillors on these easy walks around some of the familiar and lesser known parts of the Parish. Leet outside the Village Hall at 2.30p.m.



HALL REFURBISHNENT

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Those who attended the A.G.A. were pleased to inspect the substantial progress made on refurbishing the Village Hall and its facilities. What a transformation!

The ceilings have been lowered in the kitchen and toilets and new but smaller windows have been fitted to economise on expensive heating costs.

The kitchen has been refitted with beautiful white units and work tops and enlarged to incorporate a new bar top. A replacement electric cooker is needed (see separate notice) and more china is required for serving refreshments.

Toilets New WC's and wash begins been fitted.

Toilets New WC's and wash basins have been fitted and an extra large disabled person's toilet has been created in the ladies.

Lots of rewiring has been done to improve safety standards. A ramp has been made for easy access between these upgraded facilities and the Main Hall.

Redecorating of the interior has made the place look like new.

Thanks go to the artistic efforts of Joan, Ruth and Sue. Newark's

MSC Community Taskforce has promised to make an early start on
redecorating the Main Hall.

Floor Covering will have to wait until the Committee has raised some more cash, but it is hoped that this will complete the first phase very soon.

<u>Piano</u> Eany thanks to friends of the Farndon Community for finding us our replacement piano.

Cost The total cost of this first phase will be approximately £2,800. Estimates for improving the Main Hall interior and for exterior improvements are being drawn up, so more fund raising events and donations are still required.

<u>Kain Contractor</u>: Robert Gray, whose firm has carried out the work with efficency and enthusias.

The Building Fund Friends and user groups have steadily added money to the building fund from a whole range of events and generous donations have been gratefully received form well-kishers. (Details will be published in CCN No.5-Ed.) There is almost enough cash in the Building rund to cover the cost of the first phase of improvements, listed above. A grant of £1,000 from Newark District Council has been the largest injection of money into the scheme so far. Our thanks go to N.D.C. and to Kr. Greenfield of the Recreation Department for his encouragement and advice.

Playgroup Because the Playgroup is having problems with storing their equipment, the Committee agreed to them putting up a storage shed of their own, at the rear of the Hall.
