The Gravel Pit on Balderton Lane was registered in the Parish council's name during the year.

Community Centre

The Comm. Cen. has been announced and news on the development will be published as it becomes available.

A management committee can now be formed with the express purpose of arranging the use of the building to give the best outcome and benefit for the village. The constitution must be decided as soon as poss.

Neighbourhood Watch

We are now members of the 'Ringmaster' scheme. This scheme links us to the national scheme and cost us £1 per household per year.

Trees Campaign

We have arranged for a large and free tree planting campaign to take place in and around the village as soon as possible.

We have surveyed the area and, with luck, hope to plant an avenue of trees on Drove Lane along with a variety of trees in other places. Watch this space!!!

7.5 tonne limit

The County Council are in the process of organising the exclusion of heavy vehicles from Coddington.

All the village is covered. Drove Lane to the Winthorpe roundabout is being covered by a different plan.

Obviously provision is being made for access for farming and local heavy transport Thanks must go to County Councillor Vincent Dobson for the efforts he has put in over the years. Long distance medals should be awarded to him and his wife.

Speed Restriction

Despite our best efforts, the restriction in place during road works has been removed. We will continue to try to create a safer environment for the villagers and the school children by pressing for the limit to be reduced.

We have been helped by the School Travel Planners especially Mrs Stubbs. Thanks for their input in the past. We will succeed at some point but sooner rather than later hopefully.

Children's Play Areas

We now have a new play area situated on Morgan's Close and it is being used regularly. We have asked that the play area at Thorpe Oaks be re-instated and the District Council are making arrangements to start soonest.

Thanks to D C Maureen Dobson for her work on these projects.

New Housing

60 houses on the Newbury Rd. site were transferred to Coddington after it was found that they had been built on parish land by mistake. They all received rebates on their Council tax.

At the beginning of this month there were 105 houses occupied and 15 exchanged on the Thorpe Oaks site. There is obvious pressure on the School for places.

Trees in Conservation Areas

It may be that not everyone is aware of the special rules applicable to the pruning/felling of trees within Conservation Areas. Much of the village is in the Conservation Area, if you are unsure whether you are then ask one of the Parish Councillors to look at the plan for you.

Whether or not a tree is covered by a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) you MUST get permission from the local authority if you wish to carry out any work on it. This applies to ANY tree whether a native oak or an ornamental tree if it has a trunk of 7.5 cm in diameter at 1.5m above ground. You must give six weeks notice to the local planning authority.

This is not a large tree, only about 3 inches diameter in old money, and as I walked around the village with one of the County tree officers he was able to point out more than one tree which had, in his words, been butchered without authorisation. I won't say where!

If you deliberately destroy a protected tree (with a TPO or in a conservation area) or damage it in a manner likely to destroy it, you could be fined up to £20,000.

You will normally have to plant a replacement tree if the tree was cut down or destroyed.

So, out with your tape measure before you even think about getting out the pruning saw, if in doubt, phone Mike Catchpole, the tree officer at NSDC for advice. He also maintains a list of trees with TPOs.

You may find it helpful to consult a qualified arboriculturist, a list is available from The Arboricultural Association Tel 01794 368717. Remember that not everyone who advertises their services as a tree surgeon etc is qualified.
