CODDINGTON LORRY WATCH

How It Works?

- * Local observers note details of vehicles that may be misusing the route
- * Details are then handed to the parish co-ordinator for administration or can be sent direct through to Trading Standards online using Nottinghamshire County Council website which has a dedicated Lorry Watch section. http://www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/home/business-economy/tradingstandards/lorrywatch.htm
- * Trading Standards enforce the weight restriction on behalf of Highways.
- * Trading Standards will then use the information as intelligence and coordinate our future Enforcement action accordingly.

Exemptions

Some vehicles are permitted to use weight-restricted routes and these may include:

- * Vehicles loading or unloading within the restricted area
- * Emergency vehicles
- * Vehicles in the service of the local authority in pursuance of its statutory powers or duties in connection with premises along the restricted route
- * Building and industrial demolition operations Public utility services along the route

ALL SAINTS' CHURCH CODDINGTON

Revd David Anderton, the Team Vicar writes...

There seems much worrying news around. As we hear that Britain is back in recession – the so called 'double dip' - it comes home as you walk round Newark and the shops which have closed and the ones about to. Our political leaders can't agree on the best way forward – is it the path of austerity – reducing spending to pay off our debt? Or is spending to stimulate the economy into creating further wealth for debt payments? Who is right?

Yet we are moving into a summer that will be a time of spectacle and celebration - firstly we remember and give thanks for our Queen's 60 years on the throne, her Diamond Jubilee. As we recover from those celebrations we are soon into the spectacle of the London Olympics.

In the midst of the worries can we make space for joy? Life so often seems full of opposites and contradictions. It was ever thus. In the Christian calendar we are coming to the end of the Easter season. A time that starts with the great sadness, pain and loss of Jesus dying on the cross. Yet through that comes the joy, the spectacle, the hope of his Resurrection bringing with it our way back to God.

In her Christmas broadcast at the end of last year the Queen said this:

'Although we are capable of great acts of kindness, history teaches us that we sometimes need saving from ourselves - from our recklessness or our greed.

God sent into the world a unique person - neither a philosopher nor a general, important though they are, but a Saviour, with the power to forgive. Forgiveness lies at the heart of the Christian faith. It can heal broken families, it can restore friendships and it can reconcile divided communities. It is in forgiveness that we feel the power of God's love.

When times are worrying it can bring to the for our divisions, let us use the time of joy to break down those divisions and to forgive and to seek forgiveness.

I hope to see you at our village Jubilee celebrations on 4th June or if not, perhaps on the streets of Newark on the 28th June when the Olympic Torch travels through.







The Emergency Plan

Nottinghamshire County Council has requested that Parish Councils should compile a Community Emergency Plan.

This plan helps the community prepare for an emergency and minimize any impact. Sometimes the initial response may have to rely on local people.

The CEP(Community Emergency Plan) is confidential and stored in a secure location. It covers resources and skills in the community, temporary places of safety and supporting organisations contact details.

However, help is needed to ensure that the community is kept informed during and after an event. It is suggested that a cascade system is used with named people taking responsibility for notifying others, who in turn notify further members of the community.

Five initial volunteers are needed, who would then contact five other people. If you feel you can help please contact your name with the chairman Cllr. Mr. R. O'Donnell

CODDINGTON HISTORY GROUP

Hand written notes by Godfrey Tallents (b.1848 – d.1917)Solicitor, who lived at "Coddington House", Coddington

Coddington formerly called Cotinton and Codynton, which is certainly of Saxon origin, as all villages ending with ham or ton were Saxon. It is clean and healthy village standing on an eminence 2. 1/2 miles East of Newark on the road to Sleaford, Lincolnshire, in the Newark Division of the county of Nottinghamshire, Southern Division of warpentake of Newark, rural deanery of East Newark, Archdeaconry of Nottingham and diocese of Southwell. It was given by the Conqueror to his half brother, Odo of Bayeaux, having been held by Botild, Uluric, and Bugo under the confessor. The vassals or Tenants of Odo who occupied the land were Losuardus and Oulchalk. In the reign of Edward 11 we find Coddington in the hands of the Bishop of Lincoln, John de Nevill of Rolleston, and the Prior of St. Katherine's near Lincoln. In 1404 the fifth year of Henry 1V, Henry de Codynton parson of Bottesford, having had a licence from previous King Richard 11, founded a chauntry at the alter of St. Peters, in the parish of Codynton, (which alter stood probably in the South aisle) for our priest to pray for him while he lived, and for his soul after his decease; and for the soul of John de Codynton late parson of Adesham, and for their fathers and mothers, brother, and sisters, and benefactors, to which he gave five messuages, three tofts, and 171 acres of land, with the appurtences, in Codynton Holme by Muskham (at one time Holme was on the Muskham side of river).

In 1301, a Walter de Codynton was appointed Vicar at Newark Parish Church and was held by him until 1320. The richest brass in the county of Leicester, on the floor (1404) of the chancel of Bottesford Church, commemorative of Henry de Codynton rector Bottesford and Prebendary of Southwell.

It appears that John Askwell was the first priest nominated by the founder, whose successors after the death of the said Henry de Codynton, were to be named by the prior of Thurgaton. Thornton in his history tells us Walter de Maresco had some share in Cotinton, for which he bought the King a pair of scarlet breeches, but it was aliened when Robert de Passelewe, in his times King Henry 111, let this sarjeancy to the Prior of St. Katherine's for 40 shillings per annum, being twenty two Bovats, then valued at £4.8s per annum, Robert de Porter held two Bovats which were of the Sarjeancy of twenty Bovats, which the Prior of St. Katherine's held

of the King in Codinton about 8 (a Bovat = as much land as one yoke of oxen can cultivate in one year).

John Ashwell priest, is mentioned in the Annuls of Newark (P27) in connection with Henry de Codynton, nearly 400 years later the same name comes up again at Coddington in Thomas Ashwell, son of a farmer there, and surgeon at Newark" probably only presented by a weak constitution and precarious health from figuring among the clinics and Coopers of that day.

A pulmonary complaint obliged him to quit London – he returned to Newark where he practised his profession with reputation, died in London, 1813, aged more than 60.

The Ashwells owned a great lot of land in Coddington; the late Col. James Thorpe bought all the land and Cottages from the Ashwell family.

In the sixth year of Edward V1, these chauntry lands were given to Sir Edward Bray, John Thornton, and John Danby, but having been restored to their legitimate owners by Queen Mary, were by Elizabeth bestowed on Thomas Leonard alias Pocklington, and John de Codynton.

The lands belonging to St. Katherine's Priory were in the reign of Edward V1 given to Mr Cavendish and his heirs.

Being of a yearly value of 67s 4d, p.s AD 1042 or a little later, £9 this sum probably, equivalent to £900 of our money. P.s the Pocklington family we find were very numerous in this neighbourhood. In the history of Collingham by Dr. Wakes he mentioned one William Pocklington a justice of the peace in 1642 and his father John Pocklington was a resident in the reign of King James 1. There were members of that family as late as 1700. A Roger Pocklington was Mayor of Newark 1711. A Joseph Pocklington of Carlton on Trent was sheriff in the year 1774, and in Newark church we find many inscriptions on stones in the name of Pocklington.

Codinton in the records of Nomina Villarum, answers for an intise? villa and the Prior of St. Katherine's by Lincoln, John de Nevill (of Rolleston) and the Bishop of Lincoln, were certified to be lords of it.

In 1669 the houses of Parliament showed zeal for the church and state by adopting an act for the suppression of dissent. Greatly had the church suffered. King Charles 11 was very much opposed to the bill. Its provision ordered returns to be made, stating the frequency of nonconformist meetings in every village together with the number and sort of people attending them. The names of speakers, and of the person whose house the congregations met.

An extra parochial farm, known as Eagle Woodhouse, was the property of the Knights of Eagle Hall, and so was the rectory of Marnham. A certificate of their lands, taken in the time of Edward 11 (A.D. 1316) shows that they received rents from Coddington and many other places.

In the reign of Henry 11. A.D. 1171, A Bull was issued by Pope Alexander, ordering the payment of certain sums of money by every village and hamlet in the country. So much we learn from the Liber Albus of Southwell Minster. This Pentecostal offering, as it was called, had to be carried to Southwell on Whit Monday of each year. Each place contributed according to its size and importance. We do not know what was paid when the custom began; but a record still exists of the offerings made in the twenty second year of Queen Elizabeth, from it we gather that N. Collingham gave 2/-, S. Collingham 1/8, Newark and Nottingham sent 13/4 each, Caunton 10d, Tuxford 3/-, Upton 3/-, N. Muskham 2/4, Southwell 5/-, and Sutton on Trent 4/- Coddington.

From Dr. Wates History of Collingham.

The 600 years of Saxon domination furnish nothing authentic to the History of Coddington and yet it is proper to mention and event of those times not improbably connected with its neighbourhood. For so much we consider the reputed fact that Paulinus, the first missionary from Rome, who preached Christianity to the Saxons of Notts., lived and laboured at Southwell. Our holy religion had been brought into the South of England by Augustine 20 or 30 years before, but for its reintroduction into these parts we have to thank Ethelburga, daughter of the King of Kent, and consort of the unfortunate Edwin, though married to a heathern she held fast by her faith, and her influence a Queen, strengthened by that of her Chaplin Paulinus, so led to overthrow of heathern worship in Northumbria.

The church dedicated to All Saints, was a small Norman fabric originally, built in the tenth century. But in the year 1864 and 1865 it was rebuilt, embracing the whole fabric, with the exception of the Tower, the early English doorway, and some of the windows were retained. At a cost of £2,000 from the plans of Mr. G.F.Boddy, and the 5 bells were recast by Messrs Taylor of Loughborough, the church which is of stone now consists of chancel, with organ chambers, serving also as a vestery, nave aisles, South porch and a embattled tower, with eight pinnacles, the nave is separated from the aisles by arcades of three arches on either sides, supported on the north by octagonal and on the south by cylindrical piers.

The chancel organ was built by Messrs Bevington, and was presented by Col. James Thorpe J.P. (High Sheriff of Nottinghamshire) 1872, as a thank offering for the recovery of H.R.H. the Prince of Wales from a grievous sickness.

The stained glass window were executed by Messrs Morris & Faulkner, of Hoborn, London,. The churchyard was enlarged, and planted with ornamental shrubs in 1866 by Col. Thorpe.

The South Aisle is in the decorated style, and the stone seat at the bases of its pillars are well worthy of notice, the grand old font too is worthy of notice.

The Communion table stalls, Sedalia, and reredos are of oak the latter carved coloured and gilt, the seats are all of oak.

In 1890 a beautiful oak screen was erected from a design by Mr G.F. Boddy A.R.A., F.S.A. architect of London, at the sole cost of the late Col. Thorpe J.P. and the whole of the church wainscoted in oak; there are several stained glass windows, one of which in the South Aisle was placed to the memory of Mrs Thorpe the benches are all of oak and will seat 200.

Thornton in his history of Notts. Coddington appears to be a larger village than Barnby, here is a chapel dedicated to All Saints, of little note, it has a tower with 3 bells .It is served by Rev. Thomas Wakefield, and with Syerston is attached to Stoke.

The register is in good condition and dates from the year 1701. (Thornton H. of Notts 1798).

When in the fourth and last siege of Newark, we find a camp of Scots stationed at Coddington (Col. Thos. Graies) quarters, from the formation of the ground on the right (facing Mr Booth's house) in Balderton Lane, there we find the trenches also a moat and there is or was a well this is the place without doubt where the camp was situated, it is high ground and commands a capital view of Newark. There was a camp at Winthorpe and one at Balderton, Coddington being midway between the two and an easy distance for communication. Sometime ago the late Col. Thorpe told me he had a cannon ball that had been dug up in the parish, and I have a lead siege bullet which I dug up in my garden and no doubt made from lead taken from a church (it was a common thing in such times to rob churches of their lead) to be made into bullets which were of a tube shape, and plate belonging to devoted cavaliers and sent to Newark Castle to be coined for the Kings use, hence the name siege pieces or siege coins - six pence, nine pence, one shilling, and half a crown, were the value of the coins and of a diamond shape - one side a and the other side" OBS Newark 1646 (the value in Roman numerals). C xxx R

A Roman camp occupied the sight of Beacon Hill (Bacon Hill in vulgar speech) many ancient spearheads and other antiquities have been found there. (Antiquary Nov. 1880) Brailsford. Beacon Hill was so distinguished a hundred years before it became a place of observation and a post of strength; the hill was lowered in 1827.

In the year 1644 March 21st History tells us Prince Rupert coming from Coddington – wards charged our wing with fury and obtained a victory over the rebels.

The National School which is a stone building and was erected in the year 1846 and enlarged in 1866 and will accommodate about 100 children it did receive from the Trustees of Birches (Charity) £70 for the keep; but now discontinued. It is now under the County Council Education of Notts. since July 1904.

Mr J.C.Hunt is head master and has held the post for many years. The first managers under the County Council were elected: The Rev. Smith vicar Colonel James Thorpe Mr G. A. Ross

Mr Godfrey Tallents Mr H. Morgan cc member The site for the school was given to build a Church School by Mr J. Thorpe of Newark and the Vicar of Stoke & Elston.

The trees planted on the Green about the year 1873 by Colonel James Thorpe.

The Farm House on the Green then occupied by a Jollands, stack yard, fires 1815 and 1827 was put out by the inhabitants with a double row of buckets of water taken from the pond on the Green; situated I understand near the stone house which stands by its self. History of Tinder Box Hall


