CODDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL - CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

I thought it might be useful to start with an update on the long awaited road resurfacing at Main Street and Balderton Lane, originally scheduled to take place in April and May. The dates have been changed to July/August this year, to enable the programme be completed without the normal traffic disruptions that occur during the School's term-time. Staying with roads, Interactive Road Signs are to be installed: 2 will be on the C208, close to the Community Centre and about 100 meters east of the Plough junction, with the third on Balderton Lane just inbound from Pages' Wood. Siting investigations and local consultations must take place, but we are now getting there!

Once again, the village has been entered for the Best Kept Village competition; judging will take place in June. One aspect everyone can help with is to prevent the littering of our paths, roads and open spaces. This has been getting bad again and our village handyman, Bruce Richmond can only do so much. Through traffic aside, we all have a part to play in keeping our village tidy; please use the bins – or your pockets – and encourage others to do the same. Continuing with anti-social behaviour, dog fouling is the subject of increasing complaints. Dog owners have a legal responsibility to clean up, and to dispose of "doggy bags" properly in the bins provided, or at home. Please do so, if you don't already.

Our Village Improvements Scheme projects continue and you may have seen the start to a new front wall section at the Scout Hall. We do need fresh ideas so come along to our next meeting at the **Scout Hall at 7.45pm on Monday 24 June**, when we shall start to consider a 5-year plan for village improvements.

Finally, County Councillor Vincent Dobson retired on 2 May 2013, after 24 years exemplary service on behalf of Coddington, as our county councillor. We are deeply grateful for his outstanding commitment and endeavour on behalf of our village.

ON THE BEAT WITH PCSO MIKE MUNRO

Cycle Theft and Security

As in any other part of the country, Newark and its surrounding Villages suffer from bicycle theft - both from street locations and from houses and out-buildings.

As a force we work hard with agencies and the public to reduce bicycle crime and to promote security.

The main area of concern is how users either leave cycles unlocked or use inadequate locks. The cycles are also left in inappropriate areas such as unlit streets, out of sight, around the corners of buildings or simply dumped on a pavement. These are all places criminals look for and know about.

Basic advice

The Home Office has issued the following advice to help protect your bicycle:

- · When buying a bike, budget for security.
- Take out insurance, either by extending your home contents insurance or through a separate policy. Cycling organisations and bike shops may offer specialist cover. Do this at the time of purchasing the bike; otherwise you may not get around to it.
- Record and register your bike.
 - Register your bicycle model, make and frame number. This assists the police in returning recovered bikes to their rightful owners. Contact your local police station for further advice.
 - Take a clear, colour photograph of your bike and make a written record of its description, including any unique features, so that you can report it accurately if stolen.
- Security mark the bicycle. A number of proprietary marking and tagging systems are available. To be effective a security marking must:
 - be clearly visible advertise that the bike is security marked or tagged. For example, attaching a clearly visible label is a simple option.
 - be secure for example, by using a tamper-resistant label, etching, etc, or an inaccessible electronic device.

- be placed in at least two separate locations, preferably on or in the frame. At least one of these locations should not be clearly visible.
- give clear information via the visible mark (label, etching, etc) that will quickly allow police to identify the method of security marking or tagging (and where applicable the registration company), and through this identify the owner.
- Crime Prevention Officers or security marking companies can advise if you are not sure what information to include.

Cold Calling

Rogue Trading concerns incidents where consumers have been 'cold called'. It refers to the practice of deliberately overcharging for unsatisfactory goods and/or services.

This includes charging for unnecessary work, damaging property deliberately in order to obtain money, leaving work unfinished and intimidating behavior in order to extort money.

It is known that some offenders travel large distances to commit crime and sometimes the teams exchange information with distraction burglars.

Clearly, not all businesses are rogue traders and not all cold callers are distraction burglars.

If you undertake some work offered by cold callers, ensure you have their business name, address and a valid phone number. Ensure all information provided is legible.

Our best advice is, if you're not sure, DON'T open the door!

Please if you think a bogus caller has called at your door or you have seen something suspicious; report it to the police immediately

Dial 101

If you believe you have a bogus caller at your home or you see a crime taking place

Dial 999

Tell the police what has happened. The earlier the police know that bogus callers are working in the area or that a crime is being committed, the quicker they can respond.

The Revd David writes....

As I write we are at the start of Christian Aid week. Since 1957 this week in May has been the focus for a mass campaign to raise money for relief of those who live in poverty around the world. Over the years millions of the familiar red collection envelopes have landed on the door mats of homes up and down the country.

But over the years the focus of Christian Aid has changed from not just raising money for immediate relief, it has moved into supporting communities seeking to raise themselves out of poverty. And it has also moved into campaigning for action to change rules and practices that keep people in poverty.

This year Christian Aid is part of a coalition of Relief Agencies behind the IF campaign. In June this year David Cameron will host the leaders of the other G8 countries when they meet in Northern Ireland. The IF Campaign wants to challenge them to address the problem that 1 in 8 of the worlds population go hungry while there is enough food for everyone.

COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS SCHEME VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Parish Council is preparing the ground work for a possible Community First Responders Scheme in Coddington. The project will require funding for equipment and this aspect is being explored at present. The scheme will only be viable, however, if there are sufficient trained responders to man it. The Council is therefore seeking volunteers to form a Community First Responders group. First Responders are volunteer members of the community who are trained to respond to emergency calls through the 999 system in conjunction with the Ambulance Service. Responders provide immediate care to patients in their local areas where distance may delay the prompt arrival of an ambulance. They are trained to deliver Basic Life Support and defibrillation to patients in Cardiac Arrest, and appropriate assistance, including oxygen administration, to patients suffering from a range of conditions.

Volunteers will be fully trained by the East Midlands Ambulance Service and the group will be equipped with a defibrillator, oxygen masks and other equipment. We are seeking those aged 18 and over, who are in reasonably good health, want to learn life-saving skills and have a full, clean driving licence. Anyone able to give up some free time can volunteer.

The CEP(Community Emergency Plan) is confidential and stored in a secure location. It covers resources and skills in the community, temporary places of safety and supporting organisations contact details.

However, help is needed to ensure that the community is kept informed during and after an event. It is suggested that a cascade system is used with named people taking responsibility for notifying others, who in turn notify further members of the community.

Five initial volunteers are needed, who would then contact five other people.

CODDINGTON COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

Coddington Community Centre continues to be well used, both by Coddington villagers and people from outside the village. There are 30 regular users this year, compared to 18 in 2011 and 24 in 2012. There has also been a welcome rise in weekend bookings, especially in children's parties, when the Centre is less heavily used. We are pleased that the School have also decided to use the Community Centre later in the year, during the planned refurbishment of school buildings.

At the moment we don't have enough storage on-site for all our regular users, and so the Trustees are looking at the cost of providing more space, and the charges which should be made for all storage. We will also be checking that all spaces used for storage are appropriate, and do not inconvenience other users.

Community Centre finances remain very tight, so that hire charges and operating costs are currently under review by the Trustees. Excluding maintenance costs the Centre is currently eating into its small reserve by over £2500 per year, a situation which cannot be allowed to continue. Trustees are looking at fund raising events and activities through various sub committees:

- A fund raising committee looking at events such as Village Ventures (in liaison with the Village Hall), a barn dance, a music hall, a dining club, quiz nights, and a jigsaw club. Any other fund raising ideas would be greatly welcomed.
- A finance and general purposes committee to seek ways of reducing the annual losses at the Centre, which have continued for several years running. The Community Centre is currently seeking a voluntary treasurer to help with the accounts.
- A liaison committee works jointly with the Chair and ViceChair
 of the Parish Council to ensure good cooperation between the
 two organisations for the benefit of the Centre and the residents
 of the village. The Parish Council are the Community Centre's
 landlord, so good cooperation is important for smooth operation
 of the lease and other topics of mutual interest.

Trustee meetings are held every two months. Suggestions and comments from the public, users of the Centre etc. are very welcome, and can be emailed to centrechair@coddington.org.uk. If you are interested in making a booking at Coddington Community Centre, would like to view the facilities, or need further details please contact Angela on 07985 386638 or via e-mail centre@coddington.org.uk

The following criteria will be used when allocating allotments.

First, for residents within the village who have no other holdings,

Second, for residents within the village who have holdings.

Third, for non -residents.

The clerk will then notify successful applicants. They will then be inducted to their allotment.

Allotments are an excellent amenity and should be valued greatly. We expect the allotments to be worked and kept in good order.

CODDINGTON LORRY WATCH

How It Works?

- * Local observers note details of vehicles that may be misusing the route
- * Details are then handed to the parish co-ordinator for administration or can be sent direct through to Trading Standards online using Nottinghamshire County Council website which has a dedicated Lorry Watch section. http://www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/home/business-economy/tradingstandards/lorrywatch.htm
- * Trading Standards enforce the weight restriction on behalf of Highways.
- * Trading Standards will then use the information as intelligence and coordinate our future Enforcement action accordingly.

Exemptions

Some vehicles are permitted to use weight-restricted routes and these may include:

- Vehicles loading or unloading within the restricted area
- * Emergency vehicles
- * Vehicles in the service of the local authority in pursuance of its statutory powers or duties in connection with premises along the restricted route
- Building and industrial demolition operations
 Public utility services along the route



A well patronised raffle added to the proceeds which raising £450 which was put to good use in paying for the electrical inspection and fixing the minor faults that came to light. CODDINGTON HISTORY GROUP NEWS

By the time you read this our season of speakers will have ended, I think they have all been enjoyed and we look forward to them restarting in September with Steven Gay speaking about 'Railways in a Yorkshire Landscape' an illustrated talk about the Settle and Carlisle Railway and the Hull and Doncaster Railway. I am assured this talk is by a retired railwayman and is for all, not just railway buffs!

In partnership with Notts CC archaeologists we have been recording the monumental inscriptions in the church graveyard. A big "THANKS" to all those who helped whether it was lots of times or just the once – you all helped us get through the inclement weather!

We now have a draft copy of a plan of the churchyard with all 453 graves marked on it, almost all with headstones but there are a few anonymous ones without in the "new" section that we would like to identify – can anyone help?

We have discovered much of interest in our efforts, some sad stories and some not - the archaeologist assured me that we have an unusual number of graves of over 90 year olds with at least two over 100. It's not necessarily a modern phenomenon either as I managed to decipher one for Mary Winterburn who died in 1799 at the good age of 90 – I wish her headstone had survived in better condition as it was very challenging! We realised that the quality and direction of sunlight made an immense difference to the legibility of difficult graves and some previously unreadable ones became readable in the late morning on a sunny day. The earliest dates are at least the 1750s – but most not easily readable and the best ones to read are granite or slate. We should have a good display of our efforts at our open day on Saturday Sept. 14th.

Thorpe Esq for many years.

1738 by an order from the Court of Chansery I find some land and houses had been sold and it also mentioned in Coddington a Cottage, homestead and Croft Rental £8.0.0. The Sand pit close Rental £6.0.0 was not sold.

From Henry & John Hages, report of the Charity Commissioners report of Charity Jan 31st 1829

P.s. The Cottage on the Green is now pulled down and the land is used as a garden, rented to the late Col. Thorpe, now occupied by Robert Bryan.

Bell's Charity

The parliamentary returns of 1786 states that – Bell by will (the date of which is not stated), gave to the poor of the parish £2 per annum, vested in his overseers

The sum of 40 shillings (supposed to be interest of the charity thus recorded) is paid to the trustees of Birche's Charity, by Thomas Fisher Esq. the proprietor of a farm, called Beaconfield, in the parish of Coddington, and carried to the same account with rents of that charity. It forms part of the fund distributed on the Tuesday before Easter.

From the commissioners report of charities Jan. 31. 1829

Ordoyno's Charity

Jacob Ordoyno, Esq. by his will, bearing date 1st June 1809, gave to the Minister and churchwardens of Coddington the sum of £20 to be by them placed out at interest, either in Public funds or such personal security as they in their discretion should approve; and he directed them to apply the interest arising there from to the use of such of the poor of Coddington as they should think fit, by four equal quarterly payments.

This legacy remains in the hands of Garret Ordoyno, Esq. the executor of Jacob Ordoyno's will, and has been ministers churchwarden for the last 30 years. He has allowed 20 shillings yearly, as interest of it, which has been distributed either in money or coals, among poor persons of the parish, appointed by himself and the churchwardens at Christmas.

From commissioners report 1829 Jan 31st.

Ordoyno's Charity

£20 invested in the Post Office savings bank in the name of the vicar and churchwardens the income of which is 10/- per year. To be given away on Xmas day by the Vicar to ten poor widows, if not ten poor widows, to the other poor people deserving men or women.

In the South Isle we find there tablet placed over three tombs in the memory of the Ordoyno family the first to the memory of the wife of Garret Ordoyno 1841 aged 62. The next is to the memory of their daughter Jane died 1848 aged 31 years, and the other one to Garret Ordoyno 1855 age 85. Garret Ordoyno owned the farm now in occupation of Mr Picksley and Ordoyno house and farm buildings stood on the same ground now known as Coddington House.

The late Col. James Thorpe J.P. & C.C. bought the farm and wood and adjoining (which is known as Ordoyno Wood, also the house and farm buildings from the Ordoyno family. The house and farm buildings were pulled down, and the late Col. built a new house (known as Coddington House) looking over a nice Park with nice gardens attached, now in the occupation of Godfrey Tallents Esq. Town Clerk of Newark. At our time the Ordoyno family were well known and well to do family, the name is now about extinct. I find a book called (Flora Nottinghamiensis) plants grown naturally in the County of Notts. By Thomas Ordoyno, Newark 1807 Thomas Ordoyno was a son of Garret Ordoyno. And another son was called Garret Ordoyno. I find there was a Jacob Ordoyno twice churchwarden at Newark church 1791 & 2.

In Newark Parish Church

A neat Monument Sacred to the memory of Garret Ordoyno

Who departed this life, Nov. 29th 1795, aged 72 years Also of Jacob Ordoyno Who died a Bachelor

June 9th 1812, in his 78th year.

This monument was, erected as a tribute, of gratitude, by Garrett Ordoyno, Of Coddington, Son and Nephew of the above.

There is one son now living at Newark age over 80, born at Coddington. After the land was sold, this son Garrett Ordoyno bought Regent Street. 18 houses from Mr. Shaw and he occupied the middle house himself in the year 1892 they were advertised for sale and H. Morgan bought them. Ordoyno could not keep them any longer he came down from bad to worse a complete wreck.

Written on scrap paper by Godfrey Tallents not dated, the scrap paper dates are: -

Coddington Horticultural Show July 23rd 1900 Coddington Horticultural Show July 27th 1905 Newark & district Hospital March 1906

This article was written before 1917 as Godfrey Tallents died in 1917

interesting games and crafts!




