CODDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL - CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

I would like, first, to mention all those who made the 'Carols Around the Tree' such a great success in December. There is a full report in this edition but our thanks go to Coddington Community Spirit, the School, All Saint's Church, the WI and the Choir. Once again RS Gray and Son (Stapleford Lane) gave generous support to our obtaining the Village Christmas Tree.

In December's Village News I referred to Nottingham County Council's proposed Minerals Plan, including the proposal to extract sand and gravel, from 2023, in Coddington (north of the A17 and to the east of Drove Lane). Your Parish Council has written expressing strong objections. You may have also noted, in the local press, comments on the ongoing Electoral Review of Newark and Sherwood District Council— this revises the ward boundaries for electing district councillors. We have objected forcefully to the Electoral Commission regarding its astonishing proposal to link Coddington with Balderton (North). We have suggested, instead, linking to the Beacon ward, with which we share so many common interests.

In January we attended a meeting about broadband speed improvements for "weak" areas in Nottinghamshire. For some of these, including the Drove Lane, Beckingham Road, The Green and Morgan's Close area, BT will start work this year (with the County Council) to upgrade the service. No firm completion dates are given but the project is now underway! Other village households already have the opportunity to sign up with their internet providers for better speeds – the providers will advise on charges. The improvements, however, can be impressive.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held at 7.30 pm on Thursday 17 April, in the Village Hall. There will be an Open Forum when residents can voice their ideas or concerns. Please come along and talk with us!

'Come and Worship -Try it out'

Christmas may be a fading memory now, but I was greatly

encouraged by the numbers of people who attended our Christmas services, Messy Christmas, the Christingle, Carols by Candlelight, Crib Service and Midnight Mass. Earlier last year, we had a Visioning Day when we thought about how the church community could continue to grow in its mission as God's people in this place, and one area we looked at is how we might enable those who wish to be a part of the worshipping community on a Sunday, but aren't able to access the current services. As a result of this from the beginning of March we are having a six month trial with a different pattern and style of services. The times of some services will change and so will the content. In particular there and Celwill be a Family Communion Service at 4pm on the 3rd Sundays of the month which I would encourage those with children to try out. The Evening Prayer on the 2nd Sunday will be following the modern Common Worship form, while that on the 4th Sunday will continue to be in the traditional language of the Book of Common Prayer. When there is a 5th Sunday in the month we will offer worship in different styles from the world wide church such as the Taizé and Celtic traditions.

Where we are at as of February 2014:

Good News to share — English Heritage have approved our Stage 1 submission which means that they will release their share of costs — towards 50% of the total outlay. Next bit of good news - the estimate for work to be done has slightly reduced so we only have to raise around £80K Ok, a bit of a challenge but ..

Already, with grant aid submissions and offers, donations and fundraising we are up to about a third of our contribution. Many people within our community are working very hard and coming up with a range of different fund raising activities. Have you heard about the Village Walking Group?

2014 sees Coddington WI turn 80 years old. Quite an achievement we feel. We have had very small numbers in the past, but at the moment we are thriving with around 60 current members, and about 40 members attending each month.

We try to have a varied programme to cater for all tastes. In November we had Geoff Capes talk about how a wayward youth from rural Lincolnshire became a world traveller due to his sporting prowess. He said he had competed in the shot put at the highest levels winning Commonwealth medals but missing out on an Olympic title. He told how he had developed his strength on his family farm, so lifting tractor tyres in the World's Strongest Man competition had been relatively easy. He had won the title of the World's strongest man and had tossed the caber at the highland games, shaking hands with the Queen. Geoff said the desire to be the best never leaves you so, he has entered and won several top prizes with his new passion for breeding budgerigars.

Our December meeting took the form of a Christmas party, with all members bringing a contribution. The party began with entertainment from the 'Songbirds' while members enjoyed a glass of wine and some nibbles. Dilys Hinchley and Pat Hemingway, two Coddington members, finished off the evening with a selection of Christmas poems and prose. Members wrapped parcels of sweets for the competition and collected toiletries, which were given to the Newark Women's refuge.

The WI again prepared and served a Sunday lunch to around 50 senior citizens of the village. Marilyn Membery devised the 3 course menu and other WI members helped with the cooking and serving. This annual event is funded by the Coddington United Charity and is open to any senior citizens living in the village. After the lunch the 'Songbirds' provided musical entertainment.

Our January meeting had such a vibrant speaker that any January blues were swiftly forgotten. Judy Theabold, a presenter from Radio Lincolnshire, treated Coddington WI to a hilarious account of her life. Members were laughing from the beginning of the talk to the end as Judy recounted how younger journalists were amazed at her shorthand, little realising she struggled to read it back, and related various anecdotes from her time at Radio Lincolnshire. The one

disappointment from the evening is that Judy is retiring and moving away so we cannot expect a return visit.

We think we have a good variety of speakers, so if you would like to come along and sample one of our evenings you are welcome to visit. We meet at 7:30 on the second Tuesday of every month in Coddington Village Hall. We also have a discussion group once a month and a walking group, as well as outings to the theatre. The next two meetings are members only, but watch for notices in our village shop to give details of our meetings. You can join us for 3 meetings before you have to decide if you would like to join.

COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS SCHEME VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Parish Council is preparing the ground work for a possible Community First Responders Scheme in Coddington. The project will require funding for equipment and this aspect is being explored at present. The scheme will only be viable, however, if there are sufficient trained responders to man it. The Council is therefore seeking volunteers to form a Community First Responders group. First Responders are volunteer members of the community who are trained to respond to emergency calls through the 999 system in conjunction with the Ambulance Service. Responders provide immediate care to patients in their local areas where distance may delay the prompt arrival of an ambulance. They are trained to deliver Basic Life Support and defibrillation to patients in Cardiac Arrest, and appropriate assistance, including oxygen administration, to patients suffering from a range of conditions.

Volunteers will be fully trained by the East Midlands Ambulance Service and the group will be equipped with a defibrillator, oxygen masks and other equipment. We are seeking those aged 18 and over, who are in reasonably good health, want to learn life-saving skills and have a full, clean driving licence. Anyone able to give up some free time can volunteer.

How It Works?

- * Local observers note details of vehicles that may be misusing the route
- * Details are then handed to the parish co-ordinator for administration or can be sent direct through to Trading Standards online using Nottinghamshire County Council website which has a dedicated Lorry Watch section. http://www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/home/business-economy/tradingstandards/lorrywatch.htm

Trading Standards enforce the weight restriction on behalf of Highways.

* Trading Standards will then use the information as intelligence and coordinate our future Enforcement action accordingly.

Exemptions

Some vehicles are permitted to use weight-restricted routes and these may include:

- Vehicles loading or unloading within the restricted area
- * Emergency vehicles
- * Vehicles in the service of the local authority in pursuance of its statutory powers or duties in connection with premises along the restricted route
- Building and industrial demolition operations
 Public utility services along the route

Wooden Jigsaw Afternoon, Saturday 3rd May, 1-4pm

Wooden jigsaws feel very different to cardboard puzzles and the piece shapes are more interesting and varied, so if you like puzzles and you've never tried wooden ones this is an opportunity not to be missed.

There will be about twenty five jigsaws for you to choose from, including both vintage (1920s to 1960s) and new wooden puzzles, in many styles. There will also be several Wentworth jigsaws (with their fancy shapes or whimsies) the classic vintage hand-cut brands of Victory, Chad Valley and Ponda, some puzzles cut by amateurs and a puzzle by Artifact (extraordinary shapes demonstrating 4-colour map theory).

NEWARK COMMUNITY FIRST AID

Newark Community First Aid is providing FREE first aid courses in local communities including CODDINGTON.

NCFA is a local charity with the objectives of providing first aid training and first aid cover at local events. The European Reference Centre for First Aid Education has identified that the United Kingdom is far behind other countries in the number of people with first aid skills. In Germany 80% and in Norway 95% of adults have first aid skills; in the UK the figure is 10%. This clearly can result in more suffering and even death due to a lack of adequate first aid when an incident occurs.

NCFA is intending to increase the number of people with these vital skills in Newark and surrounding villages. Our short 2½ hour course is designed to provide candidates with knowledge of how to recognise and manage life threatening conditions. The course involves practical work to ensure the candidates develop the vital skills needed to provide effective first aid. Candidates will learn how to manage an incident, examine a casualty and carry out basic life support. The areas covered will include: heart conditions, unconsciousness, managing the non -breathing casualty, severe bleeding and shock.

We have 9 highly qualified and experienced trainers who lead the sessions and they will be assisted by additional staff that will monitor and coach candidates so that the training is effective and enjoyable. We are aware that people can be put off from attending because courses are not affordable or easily accessible.

We have therefore tried to solve these problems by working in partnership with Parish Councils, Churches and owners of local halls so as to provide the courses locally and free of charge. Courses are open to anyone over the age of 14 but young people between 14 and 18 should be accompanied by an adult. <u>Coddington History Group – some stories</u> from the graveyard.

As you may remember, in the bitter cold of last March some members of our group began to record the memorial inscriptions in the churchyard. Surprisingly perhaps, we all found it interesting in many ways and some of the graves obviously had stories to tell. Jackie Armstrong was particularly fascinated and challenged by the verses that some had and went on to research the source of the verses and further information about the people concerned. We displayed some of the results at our Open Day in September and thought a wider audience might appreciate some of the stories.

The first is rather a sad story I'm afraid, of the three sons of **Henry & Elizabeth Hemsley (Henry, Arthur, William) 1869 -70** (Grave Ref 110, situated in the SE section of the graveyard, in line with the east end of the church)

DEAR TO THEIR PARENTS, TO THEIR GOD MORE DEAR, THREE LITTLE BROTHERS SWEETLY SLUMBER HERE; BLEST IS THEIR STATE, FROM SIN AND DANGER FREE. TO US THEY DIED; THEY LIVE, O LORD, TO THEE.

Other versions of the verse use an alternative last line:

TO US THEY DIED - BUT NOW THEY LIVE WITH THEE.

The church records show us that on 12th December 1869 Henry Hemsley (gardener) and his wife Elizabeth had three sons baptised - Henry, Arthur and William. Tragically that winter they buried all three within 8 weeks:

Henry on 21st December 1869, Arthur on 27th December and William on 15th February 1870.

In the 1871 census the family were living in household 63, on Church Lane (now called Chapel Lane, probably in one of the two rows of cottages next to the Chapel – of which one row still stands and is now one house). Henry Hemsley, 25 years old, a gardener from Ratcliffe, his wife Elizabeth, aged 30 years from Cropwell Butler, and baby Herbert, 1 month old.

Following on from the sad death of the triplets, the couple baptised further children:

22.3.1871 - Herbert Hemsley, 16.6.1872 - Arthur Hemsley, 7.1.1874 - Elizabeth, daughter.

However, further misfortune came to the family on 7th January 1874 when Elizabeth Hemsley was buried, aged 36 years, the same day that her baby daughter was baptised and given her mother's Christian name, so she presumably died from complications of childbirth. Elizabeth's gravestone is partly buried in one of the yew trees not far from her sons' grave. There are traces of a quotation, but it is no longer legible.

There are no Hemsleys recorded in either the 1861 or 1881 census. The family probably moved away from the village.

The next verse also belongs to a child's grave, that of **Emma Florance Hewison Wright** (Grave Ref 282, very near the corner of the garden of "The Gables") Emma was the adopted daughter of William & Harriet Hewison, she died June 26th 1889 aged 2 years.

WASH ME IN THE BLOOD OF THE LAMB AND I SHALL BE WHITER THAN SNOW

This dramatic line forms part of the refrain of a hymn, 'Blessed be the fountain', by ER Latta, the first verse is:

Blessed be the fountain of blood,
To a world of sinners revealed;
Blessed be the dear Son of God;
Only by His stripes we are healed.
Tho' I've wandered far from His fold,
Bringing to my heart pain and woe,
Wash me in the blood of the Lamb,
And I shall be whiter than snow.

In the 1881 Census the Hewisons appear in Balderton Lane: William Hewison aged 33, maltster labourer from Hartlepool, Durham Harriet Hewison, his wife aged 31 from Coddington.

We do not have a record of their marriage in Coddington so Harriet's maiden name is not known. In 1891 the couple listed as aged 42 are still living on Balderton Lane next to the Dikes, and after the loss of their little adopted daughter have no children at home. The couple aren't listed in the 1901 census and we don't yet know anything about the origins of their adopted daughter or her parents – but someone in the vicinity clearly does since the grave is obviously visited fairly frequently.

If you know who cares for this grave please let us know, we would dearly like to find out more about her.

It does seem that verses are frequently put on the gravestones of small children, but here is part of a biblical quotation for Nellie Ross who was about 76 when she died on 27th January 1945:

THEY THAT SHALL WAIT UPON THE LORD SHALL RENEW THEIR STRENGTH

This is from Isaiah 40:31 "But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint."

The 1881 Census gave the Hall Farm household as:

George Ross aged 36, Sophia his wife aged 39 and their family all born in Coddington: Sophia A aged 7; Nellie aged 5; George A aged 3; Sister-in-law Ellen Allen aged 41; plus their servants.

At their Well Green home on census night 1901 were George (Farmer and Maltster) & Sophia A, with family Sophia; Nellie and George A; plus their servants.

In 1928, 1932, 1936 Nellie was listed in trade directories as a tax collector, whilst in 1941 she was Clerk of Parish Council.

George Ross, died on 11th May 1915 in his 70th year; his wife Sophia, died on 5th July 1916 in her 81st year.
