CODDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL - CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The most significant event to bring to your attention in this issue is the negotiation with Newark and Sherwood District Council (NSDC) for the transfer of the freehold of the Community Centre, and site, to the Parish Council (CPC). I hope that you managed to read the leaflet for each household, which announced the Extraordinary Parish Council Meeting to be held on 28 January to discuss the proposal. I was pleased to see some 20 residents attend that day to ask questions and offer their views. Also present to provide more information and to answer questions were Maureen Dobson, our District Councillor, and 2 officers from NSDC. The Centre is currently leased from NSDC by CPC, who then sub-lease it to Coddington Community Association (CCA) to manage etc. The terms of the lease (34 years left) include return of the Centre in its original condition! There are already some issues eg wooden fascia and soffits, car park flooding etc which CPC/CCA must deal with on a continuing basis. Prior to transfer NSDC will spend some £21,000 – £24,000 to replace all wooden fascia and soffits with UPVC, install solar panels to reduce the large electricity bills, and resolve the car-park flooding.

The Parish Council voted to accept the NSDC proposal for transfer, subject to the prior satisfactory completion of all the agreed remedial works, and the provision of a satisfactory legal agreement. We will keep you advised on progress. The minutes of this, and of all our meetings, can be read on the Coddington website's Parish Council section.

Looking ahead, the Annual Parish Meeting will be held at 7.30 pm on Thursday 23 April 2015 in the Village Hall. This is an opportunity for residents to voice their ideas or concerns so please come along. Hopefully, a reprsentative from Sherwood Forest Hospital Trust will be giving a presentation on the work of Newark Hospital.

Glancing back through the diary it is now a few weeks since the Christmas Carols Around the Tree service at the Community Centre. However, the common feeling was that this year's event was the best yet, so we are all grateful to the WI, Coddington Community Spirit, All Saints' Church, and the School for their contributions. Our thanks again go also to R S Gray and Son (Stapleford Lane) for their support to providing the tree.

Coronation/Main Hall Refurbishment

The major refurbishment of the Coronation Hall was mainly funded by the gravel extraction company FCC via WREN under the Landfill Tax Scheme and was completed in early January 2015. FCC operate the Staple Lane landfill site at Cotham and employ WREN (Waste Recycling Environmental, a not-for-profit company) to distribute funds to eligible causes within 10 miles of their sites. Over the last few months contractors and volunteers have worked to make significant improvements to the hall that will reduce heating bills and the need for long term maintenance whilst making it much warmer to use.

Roofing specialists Stormseal of Leicester replaced the asbestos/cement roof sheets with Kingspan panels which have 125mm of insulation sandwiched between inner and outer steel sheets. For the outer surface we chose a green to complement the forest green walls. The roof support timbers were all found to be in good condition making this a straightforward replacement job and we retained the internal hardboard ceiling panels so as not to lose the excellent acoustic qualities of the hall.

Changes to the lighting were undertaken by Viking Electrical of Newark. The obsolete fluorescent tube lights were changed for state of the art LED panels that not only come on straight away without flickering but also emit a light much closer to natural daylight - a particular boon for the art class.

Next on the scene was MCA Joinery who manufactured and fitted double glazed windows to replace our original single glazed units. Based at their workshop just outside Southwell MCA's owner lives in Coddington and has been helping with the volunteer part of the project by supplying materials and loaning his scaffolding tower.

The project started and finished with volunteers insulating the walls. This involved removing all the external shiplap cladding to the building, repairing any areas that were structurally unsound or infected with rot, treating with preservative all exposed woodwork, fitting the insulation, membrane, battens and new cladding, and applying stain. Along the way we brought the central heating electric wiring up to standard and re-hung our three metre projector screen whilst working around hall bookings as much as possible. Twenty volunteers worked on this part of the refurbishment and we are most grateful to all of them. We are also grateful for the patience of the hall users who

have had much to put up with over the last few months and to Coddington Scouts for providing an alternative venue when necessary.

We felt that the refurbishment was so significant that we had to have a **celebration** now they are finished, this will be on **Sunday 8th March** - see the separate notice for details.

Maintenance Mornings.

With the FCC/WREN project over we have restarted regular sessions on the morning of the second Wednesday of each month doing maintenance and minor improvements — everyone is welcome, give Dave Turner a ring (708781) or just turn up on the day. Looking to the future, we are now working towards 'Phase Two' which we hope will see the same improvements that have benefited the Coronation Hall applied to the Reading Room - the original corrugated iron part of the Village Hall. If we are successful this will involve a change to the layout with a new entrance and new toilets which will enable the current toilet areas and corridor to be combined as a separate independently usable small meeting room. Fingers crossed!

Meeting Room Chairs

The ten bent wood chairs kept in the small meeting room have recently been repaired and re-polished thanks to a grant from the Councillor's Fund of Maureen Dobson our representative on Nottinghamshire County Council. The work was undertaken by Revill Brothers of Retford and was their last major job before the firm closed with the retirement of the last working brother. Interestingly Mr Revill instantly spotted that the chairs were made in Poland almost certainly before the end of the nineteenth century and could well be part of the original furnishings of the "Gentlemen's Reading Room".

Sound System

A grant from Newark Area Arts has enabled us to purchase a basic sound system for the hall. The speakers were temporarily hung from the roof trusses to enable the system to be tried out at Coddington History Group's January meeting and proved to be a success. Donated TV brackets have been modified to permanently mount the speakers whilst we consider how best to house the control unit. The system will be available to all users in the near future.

Coronation Hall Floor

During half term week in February the hall will be closed to allow a specialist flooring contractor to sand and re-polish the floor. We have chosen half term

to minimise disruption as several of our users meet in term time only. Groups that meet during half term will be accommodated at the Scout Hall.

Fund Raising

The two Village Ventures events went well. October's "Babylon" caused a few headaches when the leading lady was offered a major part in The Railway Children in London and withdrew at short notice, so the two remaining actors performed "Beulah" instead. Most people really enjoyed it; very professionally and imaginatively played it was thought provoking and moving. Richard Durrant's "Candlelit Christmas" sold out and all agreed that it was a superb evening's entertainment with stunning guitar playing by Richard and wonderful singing by Amy. The two events added over £700 to the new chairs fund. By the time you read this we will have had an extra event "Spoonface Steinberg". This would have been staged at Maplebeck's new village hall but for delays in the building works so we volunteered to take it at short notice relying on posters/flyers/word of mouth for publicity.

Coddington WI

Coddington WI is one of the oldest institutes in Nottinghamshire. We have around 60 members and meet in the Village Hall at 7:30 pm on the 2nd Tuesday of every month. We pay an annual subscription and then the meeting itself is free although we pay 50p to cover the cost of the refreshments. Some members of the institute belong to our monthly walking group. The walks take place on the third Wednesday of the month at local venues and end with a pub lunch. We also have a small discussion group meeting in the Village Hall kitchen on the fourth Tuesday of the month. A variety of topics are discussed followed by tea and biscuits.

This last Christmas our WI decided to sponsor a tree in the event in the parish church so the November meeting was dedicated to making tree decorations. Three institute members, Jane Hedge, Wendy Parrett and Gill Southgate gave short demonstrations and then members were given time to try them out for themselves. Many members took materials home and completed the decorations in their own time. Others adapted the ideas to create decorations of their own. The tree was crowned with a beautifully dressed fairy made by member Wendy Parrett. We were very proud of our tree which was totally decorated with handmade items.

We held a member's only Christmas party in December. This took the form of a faith supper when everyone brought a plate of food to be shared for the party. Two members, Dilys Hinchley and Pat Hemingway entertained with amusing Christmas poems and the evening finished with everyone singing Christmas songs. Our monthly competition in December is always a wrapped parcel of sweets which are collected, together with donated toiletries, and given to the Newark women's refuge.

In January we were entertained by the Reverend Colin White who gave a brief history of magic and performed a variety of illusions. He was assisted by several members of the institute. The WI also prepared and served the meal at the annual village seniors' lunch. The money for this event is provided by the Coddington Trust Fund but volunteer WI members cooked and served the food. This year member Norah Reed devised a menu of soup, turkey plus trimmings, pavlova or apple pie, cheese and biscuits, Christmas cake and mince pies. The WI provided prizes for a raffle with this year's proceeds going to the Newark Women's Refuge.

We are now preparing for our AGM in February and the start of our new programme, so why not come along to one of our meetings to sample the WI; you don't have to join immediately!! 

- Trading Standards will then use the information as intelligence and coordinate our future enforcement action accordingly.

Exemptions

Some vehicles are permitted to use weight-restricted routes and these may include:

- Vehicles loading or unloading within the restricted area
- Emergency vehicles
- Vehicles in the service of the local authority in pursuance of its statutory powers or duties in connection with premises along the restricted route
- Building and industrial demolition operations
- Public utility services along the route

His quest for information on the original occupants of Old Hall Gardens led to us receiving photographs of the construction of one of the houses there and we noticed that just visible in the background is the original "Community Centre" that was on what is now Thorpe Oaks.

It seems to be a cousin of our Coronation Hall... Does anyone have any memories of it – or indeed a better photo? And why was it the Jubilee Club – whose Jubilee?

Fund Raising

We are now looking to bring the electrics in the hall in line with today's requirements. We have replaced the lights in the main hall and can see what we are doing. However the building needs to be rewired so we are still looking to raise funds for these ongoing projects.

Once this project has been completed we will be looking to carry out repair works in the original building as the ceilings are deteriorating. Our plans are to change the way we use the space to open up the entrance way as a better access for wheelchair users. Then we need to rework the kitchen which has suffered from a few leaks in recent years that have taken their toll on the cabinets.

We also intend to install lockable gates to enclose the rear of the building so the Beavers can experience a night under canvas.

We still have a lot to do before we are on top of the hall maintenance so any ideas or help we can get will be greatly received. We are still collecting textiles, 1kg raises 40p for the group. We do well from this activity achieving around £300 per year. Any textiles donated which can be used are distributed to those in need both here in the UK and abroad. Any textiles which cannot be reused are turned into Industrial rags. If you have any items that you have finished with please get in touch and we can arrange for collection

Our last regular fund raising activity is the group lottery. This can be joined for an annual fee of £10. For this you will be assigned a number which will be entered into the monthly draw. Each month we draw 3 numbers with the 1^{st} place receiving £15, 2^{nd} place receiving £10 and 3^{rd} place £5.

Coddington Conservation Area

In 1992 some of the older parts of Coddington were designated as a conservation area. A map of the designated area from the Newark and Sherwood District Council website is shown opposite, and you can easily find more information about conservation areas from the planning section of the website:

http://www.newark-sherwooddc.gov.uk/conservation/

If you live in a conservation area there are additional planning requirements on your property, garden and boundaries that you need to make yourself aware of. For example, you will need to apply for permission prior to carrying out work on trees in your garden and there may be constraints on demolishing structures or changing boundary walls, fences or hedges.

A conservation area is of special architectural, historic or landscape interest which should be preserved or enhanced – so planning authorities have to consider the effects of any planning proposals or development policies on them. Each area has special features that contribute to its value and sense of place which are described in its Conservation Area Appraisal Report (CAAR). It is not just the age, style and mix of the buildings, but may include local customs, the historic layout of roads, paths and boundaries, characteristic building and paving materials, views from roads and public spaces, important trees, hedges and tree-cover, evidence of former land uses or industry, approaches and landscape settings.

The Parish Council also considers effects on the conservation area when commenting on planning applications (within or close to the area) and in requesting tree preservation orders. Having a conservation area benefits the village - the more villagers are interested in, know about and value what makes the place they live in special the easier it is to maintain, improve or defend it against threats. Local authorities have a duty to review conservation areas from time to time and to consider if the areas should be extended.

Coddington Conservation Area Report

Coddington's Conservation Area report was written in 2002 (in the older of two formats) and after 12 years a review is well overdue. It is available on the Coddington village website:

http://village.coddington.org.uk/images/Appraisal.pdf

English Heritage states that more than half of England's conservation areas have an out of date appraisal report and three quarters have no management plan. (Successful management is greatly aided by high quality updated documents.) Newark and Sherwood has 47 conservation areas, with reports

from only 14 available on the internet. In the current economic climate this work has to championed and supported from the grassroots upwards.

The Coddington 2002 report listed special features, made recommendations and noted threats and the Parish Council successfully applied for the conservation area to be extended. **The changes can be seen on the map but have not yet been incorporated into the appraisal report.** The area now covers fields between Drove Lane, Newark Road and the former site of the RAF camp in Coddington Hall grounds, including the rare Yew Wood. This was to protect and extend:

- the open agricultural approach to the village from the north with its church view, including the footpath from the Almshouses to Drove Lane corner:
 https://www.flickr.com/photos/50241745@N05/14867693794/in/set-72157645893050529
- the setting of the Fish pond and tree-lined Newark Road as a rare 'small mature parkland landscape' deriving from Coddington Hall /Winthorpe Airbase (one of only three in Nottinghamshire: Coddington, Barnby Manor and Thorney).

These fields contain beautiful groupings of trees creating lovely sunset silhouettes. The shape of the drive and immediate grounds of Coddington Hall (demolished in the 1960s) is still clearly visible in aerial photos as mature trees and open spaces were kept when the area was redeveloped. The village and its landscape setting has varied and ecologically significant tree cover, which was brought home to us recently when we created a panorama of the landscape from Danethorpe Hill. You can see the photo (c27,000 x 2,700 pixels):

Lists of important trees (including tree preservation orders) need to be updated, the growth of hedges needs to be checked so important views aren't lost, and the newly designated areas and their concerns need to be documented. Coddington History Group has discovered information that contradicts some statements made in the 2002 Conservation Appraisal report which should be corrected.

The report talks about the physical division of the village in the 1930s and 1960s by road developments but does not address broadly the impact of more recent landscape, housing estate and road changes on the all-important setting of the conservation area. The loss of Parish land to Newark through boundary changes, the way in which housing and light industrial development is tending to fuse Newark and Coddington, the division of Parish lands by

Newark Bypass (and what industrial developments are appropriate only 350m from the conservation area) are all issues that should be considered.

Residents outside the existing conservation area might like to think about their own sense of place – what they value and dislike, what should be conserved or enhance and what we all can do to help (as individuals, as neighbourhoods and through village groups and the Parish Council). For example, the views from Newark Road across fields of grazing sheep to the Windmill on Balderton Lane enhance the journey of many families walking to school, or to the Post Office.

This year is also an important year for All Saints Church, being the 150th anniversary of its extensive renovation. It has been the heart of village life and administration since the 12thC and is the only existing building known to date back to the 17thC. I look forward to the successful completion of work on the church roof and the opportunity for all village people to celebrate with the congregation and learn more about its heritage. The church grounds with its retaining wall and railings, form a large part of the important 'green island' between Main St and Chapel Lane at the village centre. I'm sure the church would welcome volunteers to help keep the area tidy and ivy at bay. The state of the Chapel Lane retaining wall was noted in the 2002 report and this issue is becoming ever more urgent.

In fine weather we hope that you will find time to walk around the village armed with the Conservation Area map or the History Group's trail leaflet or book. Our village website also has a map of local footpaths (look under Parish Council):





Alongside the General Election this year on 7th May, will be the local council elections. Anyone wishing to stand for the Parish Council can obtain nomination papers from the Returning Officer at Kelham Hall – contact joanne.dunn@newark-sherwooddc.gov.uk for an email or paper copy. Alternatively, the forms can be downloaded from the Newark and Sherwood website. Each nominee will need a proposer and a seconder from the Parish electorate, and must be:
